

Celine Saulnier, Ph.D. is Director of Clinical Research at the Marcus Autism Center and Assistant Professor in the Department of Pediatrics at Emory University School of Medicine. At Marcus, Dr. Saulnier is overseeing the development of a diagnostic assessment core for individuals participating in clinical research within the nation's largest center for autism spectrum and related disorders. Dr. Saulnier conducted her postdoctoral fellowship and subsequently joined the faculty at the Yale Child Study Center, where she worked with Drs. Ami Klin and Fred Volkmar. At Yale, Dr. Saulnier was both the Clinical Director and Training Director of the Autism Program. She is the author of the forthcoming book *Essentials of Autism Spectrum Disorders: Evaluation and Assessment*. Dr. Saulnier currently receives funding from National Institute for Mental Health, Simons Foundation, National Institute for Communicable Diseases, and the National Alliance for Autism Research.
