Parshat Hashavuah

The Other Trail of Abraham - Rabbi Jonathan Rosenblatt

The trials of Abraham-- the defining curve of his life—begin in Nimrod's furnace and culminate at the mountain top where Isaac is bound. Again and again he is challenged to defy self-interest and instinct, to override his natural human responses, in favor of obedience to his Creator. And he passes his tests with distinction.

But there is a parallel theme in Abraham's life to which the commentators are sensitive, another species of trial: the ordeal of success. In the wake of his victory over the four kings, as the Torah opens the scene of the Brit Bein Ha-besarim (the Covenant of the Pieces) [Gen. 15:1], the Torah uses as its segue the phrase, 'and it was after these things," alerting the reader that the event unfolding is linked to the one that precedes it. Rashi records Abraham's state of mind in the wake of his miraculous military success: fear. G-d's first words to him in the second sequence: 'do not fear, Abram.' The Patriarch, rather than emerging convinced, by his victory, of his own great worthiness, pauses to wonder if he has emptied his account of merit. Success engenders humility.

Earlier in the Sidrah, the Imrei Shefer (R Shlomo Kluger) puzzles over the following verse.

ד וַיֵּלֶדְ אַבָּרָם, כַּאֲשֶׁר דְּבֶּר

And Abraham went forth as G-d commanded him

Why does the Torah reiterate 'as G -d commanded him'? It is perfectly clear from the context. Only a few verses before, the Torah recorded G-d's instructions. Something was interposed between the directive and Abraham's obedient fulfillment: the promise for the future.

And I shall make thee a great nation, and I shall bless thee and make thy name great and you shall be a blessing. And I shall bless those who bless you, and those who curse you, I shall curse, and all the families of the world shall be blessed through you.

In the wake of that promise, Abraham could easily have become drunk with self-confidence, swollen with pride, picturing himself elevated and renowned. This pride, a sin in itself, could have touched off a spiral of disobedience. Instead, the Torah records that Abraham begins his mission precisely 'as G-d commanded him,' unaffected by the promise he has just received. If anything, he has become more determined. The call to leave his land is received with the verb vayomer, usually associated with a loving gentle tone. In the record of his fulfillment, ka'asher diber is used, reflecting a sterner tone. Abraham seems, on his own, to have tightened his sense of absolute obligation, ignoring the distraction of the momentous promise. Promise engenders obedience.

The history of our People is replete with trials and sacrifices. That there is a Jewish people is a miracle. But there is nothing in our litany of suffering, nothing in the classically quoted trials of Abraham, to protect us against the special challenges posed by success, by the blessings of a blessed time in history. Even Moses feared for the day when Jeshurun would wax fat and kick. For guidance in the struggle against overconfidence and pride, against the threats concomitant with security and prosperity, we must look to the other trials of our founding Patriarch, his majestic responses to victory and promise.
