The Fellowship consists of eight sessions, each built around a topical presentation by a leading academic, community leader, or rabbi. About Rabbi Duker:

Rabbi Duker holds a B.A. and an M.A. in Medieval Jewish History from Yeshiva University. He made *aliyah* immediately after receiving *semikha* from YCT in 2004 to serve as an educator in Israel. He has taught at a number of institutions, including Yeshivat Reishit, Midreshet Lindenbaum, and World Bnei Akiva Tochnit Lehava.
