Wingspan: 72" to 90"

Size: The female bald eagle is 35 to 37 inches, slightly larger than the male.

Color: Both male and female adult bald eagles have a blackish-brown back and breast; a white head, neck, and tail; and yellow feet and bill.

Weight: Bald eagles weigh from 10-14 lbs. Eagle bones are light because they're hollow. Longevity: Wild bald eagles may live as long as 30 years

Speed: Bald eagles can fly to an altitude of 10,000 feet. During level flight, they can achieve speeds of about 30 to 35 mph.

MORE INTERESTING FACTS:

- Juvenile bald eagles are a mixture of brown and white. They reach full maturity in four years.
- The beak, talons, and feathers are made of keratin.
- Bald eagles have 7,000 feathers.
- Bald eagles sit at the top of the **food chain**.
- Lifting power is about 4 pounds.
- Their diet is mainly fish, but they will take advantage of carrion (dead and decaying flesh).
- The bald eagle is a **strong swimmer**, but if the water is very cold, it may be overcome by hypothermia.
- All eagles are renowned for their **excellent eyesight**.
- Nests are built in large trees near rivers or coasts.

"State parks are often more suitable for local or regional association meetings for several reasons, notably their affordability and accessibility," said JD Brown and Margaret Backenheimer of Association News magazine (May 2013).

Starved Rock Lodge and State Park are such a place. Conveniently located near I-80 and I-39, it's less than a 90-minute trip from most Chicagoland locations. Surrounded by 13 miles of scenic hiking trails, deep canyons, seasonal waterfalls and bluff views of the Illinois River Valley, meetings take on air of rejuvenation when participants are allowed to get out of the office and into the woods!

The rich history of this part of Illinois also offers a new perspective on the achievements of our predecessors and perhaps, changes attendees' outlooks as they plan for the future.

Starved Rock Lodge Hiking Team Adds New Hikes for 2014

For 2014, Starved Rock Lodge is excited to offer the first annual **Hike-a-palooza!** This 3-day, 35-mile adventure explores all of Starved Rock State Park and the surrounding area. Participants will hike all 18 canyons at Starved Rock State Park, visit Buffalo Rock and Mathiessen State Parks and enjoy an evening hike along the Illinois Michigan Canal.

More than 2 million people visit Starved Rock State Park each year. While visitors come to the park to get away from it all, their hiking experience sometimes lacks something. That something is history and information about where they are hiking. Starved Rock Lodge has found a way to take care of that. The Activities Staff at the Lodge began offering guided, narrated hikes (Take a Hike and a Lunch) in spring 2012. **Take a Hike** is a 4.5 mile narrated hike to spectacular LaSalle Canyon and includes lunch in a Starved Rock backpack. Take a Hike and a Lunch was such a hit that the staff decided to continue the guided hikes into the winter months, changing the name to **Guided Winter Hike**. Instead of having lunch in LaSalle Canyon, the hike ends with hot cocoa in the Lodge's Café. This increased hiking presence in the park resulted in a need for more hiking guides. Today's hiking team consists of six hikers who specialize in specific tours throughout the year. Each hiker has an extensive knowledge of Park and Lodge history and offers engaging hiking experiences for all ages. Lodge guests and Park visitors can book hikes on Saturdays and Sundays at 11am or include a hike in a midweek overnight stay package called Hike Into History. Groups traveling to or staying at the Lodge for multi-day meetings often book guided hikes as part of their visit to Starved Rock. These hikes can be customized to fit the group's interests and time frames. What better way to start the day than with a quick hike to Starved Rock and French Canyon, located less than a mile from the Lodge?

Visitors up for a hike of mega proportions can take part in one of four Mega-Hikes offered each April and September. **The Mega-Hike** is a 14 mile trek into each of the park's 18 canyons, and yes, there is a commemorative t-shirt!

The Lodge's hiking guides are always ready for an adventure and the opportunity to share the beauty and history of Starved Rock with visitors from around the world. In 2013 the Lodge's guides led more than 150 hikes for groups and individuals. Many of our guests return several times throughout the year to experience hiking during each of the park's four seasons, and some request a specific guide each time! With such a wide variety of hikes offered by the team at Starved Rock Lodge, visitors to the state park are sure to find a 'hike they will like'.
