Adult Peer Support and Family Peer Support Trainings Announced

Magellan Behavioral Care of Iowa is excited to announce a series of training opportunities for adult peer support and family peer support specialists in Iowa. Community reinvestment funding from Magellan is making this training available for peers and family peers throughout the state.

As adult and family peer support has become more recognized as a profession, there has been an increased demand for these professionals in various healthcare service delivery settings. Examples of this include the implementation of Integrated Health Homes that utilize adult peer support and family peer support, increased desire for peer centers across Iowa, as well as more peer-driven services. This expansion has produced a shortage of trained adult peer support and family peer support specialists. Magellan is pleased to be a part of this opportunity and growth for peers in Iowa.

Funding for peer support training grants has been provided to Hope Haven, Life Connections and Waubonsie Mental Health Center. These entities will provide training across the state for approximately 150 adult peers who will then be eligible to be certified as peer support specialists in Iowa. The University of Iowa, in partnership with ASK Resource Center and NAMI Iowa, will provide training for approximately 90 family peers.

These trainings are paid for by the Iowa Department of Human Services through its contract with Magellan Behavioral Care of Iowa for Iowa Plan for Behavioral Health Medicaid Community Reinvestment.
