The Foreign Trade Division is actively engaged in educational outreach to help you avoid costly export penalties.

This program is hosted by the University of Texas San Antonio SBDC, UTSA Institute for Economic Development, International Trade Center, SBA, US Commercial Service, Association of Small Business Development Centers (ASBDC), and M-PALM, in partnership with the US Census Bureau, Foreign Trade Division.

Early-registration requested by January 31, 2012. On-site registration accepted if seats are still available.

It is important you understand the current requirements of the Foreign Trade Regulations (FTR) and how to avoid penalties and possible seizure of your commodities. In addition it is vital to provide accurate and complete data in efforts to help the trade make sound business decisions. Federal Regulations require mandatory filing of export information through the Automated Export System (AES) or through the AES*Direct* for all shipments where a Shipper's Export Declaration was previously required. Penalties may be imposed per violation of the FTR from \$1,100 to \$10,000 – both civil and criminal – for the delayed filing, failure to file, false filing of export information, and/or using the AES to further any illegal activity. In accordance with the FTR, all parties to the export transaction are subject to the fines and penalties. Additionally, all AES filers are faced with new filing deadlines by mode of transportation for reporting export information.
