Travel Statistics from SFO

Domestic travel was up 0.6%, while international travel was up 1.7% through San Francisco International Airport in June 2013, compared to June 2012.

Delta Shuttle Service From LAX to SFO

Delta will begin hourly, nonstop Delta Shuttle service between LAX and SFO on September 3rd, with 14 daily flights each way.

Broadway Interchange Renovation

A \$75 million remodel of the Broadway interchange at Highway 101 in Burlingame is tentatively scheduled to begin in early summer 2014 with completion anticipated for 2016. The reconstruction will replace the existing bridge between Rollins Road and Old Bayshore Highway, with a new structure to simplify the road. The structure will range from six to eight lanes, and will be slightly to the north of the existing structure. Click **here** for more.

SamTrans and the city of Millbrae have provided pedestrians with a safe, new crossing on El Camino Real to reach the Caltrain/BART Station. The Victoria Avenue project created a street crossing signal with a well-defined walking path and added sidewalk, bus stop, and landscape enhancements to improve safety and access to the station for pedestrians.

Yellow Fever Mosquito Found in San Mateo County

On August 23rd, the California Department of Public Health confirmed the identification of a yellow fever mosquito at Holy Cross Cemetery in Menlo Park. The yellow fever mosquito has the potential to transmit several viruses, including dengue and yellow fever. Avoid mosquito bites or reduce the chances of being bitten by applying repellents, using tight-fitting screens, eliminating standing water, reporting neglected swimming pools, wearing long sleeves and pants, and using netting over infant carriers.
