General Assembly 2014 Challenges

The 60-day "long" session of the General Assembly will face major challenges.

Budget

An outcome of having a one-term governor is that the General Assembly will have a biennial budget before it proposed by out-going Governor McDonnell to which our new Governor Terry McAuliffe will have an opportunity to propose amendments. Both the budget and amendments face severe problems. The past recession wrecked havoc on state revenue as it did on most business enterprises. The rate of recovery has been slow. Some state programs and services are operating at 2007 funding levels. Serious funding shortfalls need to be addressed in a number of areas including

- Localities are making reductions in their public school programs because of a shortage of funds from the state and other sources.
- The need to expand our mental health services has been made well known by several tragic events.
- A greater short term investment in preschool programs could prevent many student failures and reduce the need for remediation programs in the future.
- Our colleges need to expand their capacity to meet the growing number of students.
- Income disparity across the state continues to widen, and there is a need for more economic development in many areas of the state.
- Training the workforce for the new economy needs to expand.

Social Issues

The legislature is likely to have many bills introduced on limiting access to abortion because a number of legislators particularly in the House of Delegates feel strongly about the issue. While such bills take up a great amount of committee and floor debate time, they are likely to be defeated in the Senate or vetoed by

On the fourteenth of each month I have been joining friends and other



concerned citizens at a vigil at NRA headquarters in Fairfax. The tragic shootings at Newtown, Connecticut, took place on December 14. We want to bring attention to the issue until reasonable gun safety laws are passed. It is possible to expand background checks for gun sales to keep guns out of the hands of criminals and those who are violent while preserving Second Amendment freedom. Significant laws will be difficult to pass in Virginia, but I will continue to push for state and federal action to end gun violence.



Jane and I chose the Silver Line as our entry in the Annual Town Center Holiday Parade whose theme was "destinations" this year. We share the concern about the delay of opening the Silver Line until February or March, but the good news is that construction is complete. The additional time is related to getting the automatic train controls just right and to make sure that all safety tests are met. We look forward to joining you at the grand opening very soon.

the Governor. It is my hope that the legislature will not be featured on late-night comedy shows.

Voting

The recent close elections are likely to result in more efforts to change voting laws to eliminate errors and fraud, but the results of such laws most often suppress voting on the part of some groups and have no impact on fraud that has never been shown to exist. I will work to expand early voting opportunities and will work against efforts at voter suppression.

Ethics

I am a member of a bipartisan panel that will propose major changes to Virginia's ethics laws. Certainly reporting of gifts received by family members will be required, but it is my hope that a ban can be enacted on all gifts over \$100. Likewise, an ethics panel is needed as are stricter penalties.
