## News from Principal Albright



Across the District, there are a number of schools in various stages of International Baccalaureate (IB) authorization. Deal, with a Middle Years

Program (MYP) is by far the largest, but there are three elementary schools with a Primary Years Program (PYP), two high schools with a Diploma Program (DP), and several other schools in the process of getting authorized. What does it mean to have multiple IB programs in our District?

At Deal, our program frames our work – a rigorous approach for all students, a commitment to world languages, and real-world applications for learning. We have a strong emphasis on community service, thematic units, and IB assessment.

The PYP focuses the school around units of inquiry, trans-disciplinary learning, and a student exhibition. PYP and MYP schools share a common language in the IB Learner Profile and the teaching of world languages. The IB ends in the DP; a series of challenging courses with an emphasis on writing (the Extended Essay) and thinking (Theory of

Knowledge) that culminates in externally assessed exams.

Why should the District pursue more IB programs? Schools can use the IB to examine *how* they teach standards, and use professional development to grow this capacity. World languages, the arts and music, and PE give our students more than just the standards – they place these courses in the firmament of required classes. Each iteration of the IB grows on its predecessor. The exhibition (PYP) leads to the culminating project/personal project (MYP) leads to the extended essay (DP). How we think about students (Learner Profile) can be reflected across schools. All programs are moving towards using international criteria to evaluate teacher and student work; this will let us know how we compare and how to improve.

In the coming year, Deal will work to support all of our IB schools. We will host a World Language Festival for DCPS IB schools and we will share professional development opportunities and new initiatives. One great advantage, just getting started, is that IB schools are members of a collection of like-minded, purpose-driven schools. Deal will be a part of that here in DC.

# Teacher in the Spotlight:

## Mr. Nick Monaco, Physical Education

Mr. Monaco is a new teacher this year at Deal. Here is his story in his own words:

My name is Nick Monaco, I am a 27 year old Virginia native. I was born in upstate New York and moved to Virginia when I was 8. I am a fan of my New York sports teams -the Yankees, Jets and Knicks in particular- but I enjoy going to Nats games and to the Capitals hockey. I played many sports growing up which helped define my love for competition and coaching. I decided to forgo several smaller schools and Division I non-scholarship schools to attend James Madison University in Virginia and made the Football team as a walk-on Quarterback. I only played football for one year at JMU, but then switched and played two years of Club Baseball. Going into my junior year of college I decided to change my major from Business Marketing to Education because I didn't like the feeling of crunching numbers and sitting behind a desk every day and I missed my interactions with young children from my days as a summer camp counselor.

I changed my major to Earth Science Education and graduated on time in 2009 with a Bachelors degree in Geology, with a minor in Secondary Education. I then stayed for a one year Masters program and got my Masters of Arts in Teaching in 2010. I moved back home to Virginia and taught Earth Science and Physical Education (strange hybrid I know) my first year before being offered the full time Physical Education job. I taught at Cedar Lee Middle School in Virginia those first three years. This was actually the middle school I went to growing up, and I also worked throughout that time as a Football Coach, Baseball Coach, and Sports announcer on weeknights and weekends. After my third year, I felt the need to get away from home and present myself with a new challenge. I moved up to Arlington, VA after getting a job here at Alice Deal. I chose Deal over several other DC schools that offered me PE positions because of its sterling reputation and large list of extra- curricular activities offered.

I like to have my students being extremely active in my class. My students can attest that while I might be more stern than other teachers, I love to make a fool of myself and get them laughing. I have always believed that humor and kindness are great ways to show your students that you care about them and their success and that you are not just here to punch a time card and collect a pay check. Students can see my enjoyment in my job from this humor and my demeanor and I believe that makes them more excited to come to my class each day. Just like with the sports teams I coach, if at the end of our time together you feel you improved and can explain and show me how this happened, I feel like my job was successful.

Thank you very much for this opportunity. I am truly honored to be the Spotlight Teacher.

## Period 8: Mapmaking

In each newsletter, a Period 8 class will be highlighted. This time, it's Mr. Michael Martini's mapmaking class. This class was not held during this advisory but was offered at the beginning of the year and will be taught again in the 4<sup>th</sup> advisory. In Mr. Martini's own words,

"Mapmaking class gives students a chance to explore the power of representing data and information visually and spatially on a map. Students learned how to use mapmaking platforms including National Geographic's Mapmaker Interactive, Google Earth, scribblemaps.com, and ArcGIS Explorer Online. Using these platforms, students learned how to make inferences and conclusions by layering information (for example, climate zone and life expectancy) to make conclusions and analyze patterns. We also debated the use of GPS in controversial subjects such as the use of drones for intelligence gathering or for amazon.com to deliver packages! During most of the course students researched a topic in order to prepare a final presentation of an interactive digital map. Final projects have included a map of crime rates in major cities across the United States, an analysis of major natural disasters of the last 100 years, and a map of the North African campaign of World War II!"

Mr. Martini says "Personally, I'm into the subject because I'm a tech and map geek. What better way to share my passion than to teach students how to make their own maps. A few years ago Ms. Trenkle (8th grade teacher) introduced me to the National Geographic DC Alliance whose task it is to improve geographic literacy and educational programming in the city. They host field trips for the kids and have excellent mentors who come to the schools to teach GIS technology.

The picture below shows three of the students who were in the Period 8 mapmaking class on a different mapmaking adventure we took! It was called TAGS DC (Teachers and Geographic Students) – which is another club Mr. Martini runs about mapmaking. Those students, each year, identify a problem in the community that can be explained/improved using a digital map. Last year, the kids made a map of safe bike routes around DuPont Circle and even advocated for new bike lanes in certain areas to improve congestion and safety for riders. This year, the group hopes to make an historical map displaying the buildings and streets of Reno City before construction of the park.

There are three full time art teachers at Deal who bring a wealth of experience to your students! Students have art every day for a full advisory in 6<sup>th</sup> grade and every day for a full semester in 8<sup>th</sup> grade. 6<sup>th</sup> graders' busy schedules include materials explorations, world art, op art and stop motion animation. 8<sup>th</sup> graders are introduced to materials, study artists and art history, community art, art as social justice and graffiti art, among other subjects.

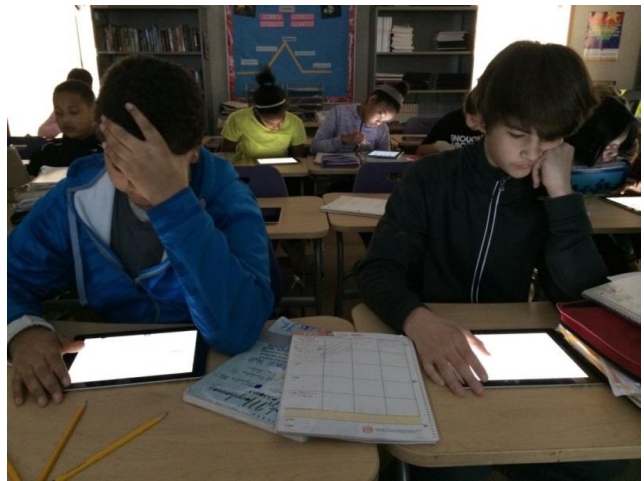
