T-SHIRT COLORS & MEANINGS

- ◆ **White** for women who died because of violence.
- ◆ **Yellow** for battered or assaulted women.
- ◆ **Red** is for survivors of rape and sexual assault.
- ◆ **Orange** for those physically abused as children.
- ◆ **Blue** for survivors of incest and sexual abuse.
- ◆ **Purple** is for individuals attacked because of their sexual orientation.
- ◆ **Lavender** represents those attacked/abused because of their gender identity.
- ◆ **Black** is for women attacked for political reasons.

The Clothesline Project (CLP) is a vehicle for women & children affected by violence to express their emotions by decorating a t-shirt. The shirts are displayed on clotheslines to raise awareness of violence against women & children.

Women Helping Women (WHW), a program of National Council of Jewish Women/ Los Angeles (NCJW/LA), is dedicated to providing high-quality, integrated mental health and supportive services to a diverse community of women, children, and families at-risk and in need.

WHW's services include our free Counseling Talkline; sliding-scale counseling for individuals, couples, families & groups; parenting workshops; Family Court Advocacy Project COURTWATCH; and the WHW scholarship program.
