

# Rules for Circulating Nomination Papers

Please read carefully and follow exactly

Circulator – Person circulating the nomination paper(s).

Elector – Person signing, printing name, providing address and municipality, and date.

Each page accommodates up to 10 electors/ signatures.

1. Do not circulate nomination papers before Monday December 1, 2014. Any paper circulated or dated before December 1 will be disqualified.
2. Do not leave nomination papers unattended on a counter or bulletin boards. Nomination papers must be directly presented to the elector by the circulator.
3. The circulator must complete the Certification of Circulator (found at the bottom of the nomination paper) *after* the electors have filled in their line. Elector signatures dated after that of the circulator will be disqualified.
4. Electors must be 18 years of age or older and live in the State of Wisconsin. Circulators must be 18 years of age or older.
5. Circulators and electors must provide their exact municipality of residence rather than their mailing/ postal address if it is different. This includes PO boxes. The Street & Number or Rural Route section for each elector's address is split into two lines. The first line is for the street address. The second line is for the municipality for mailing purposes. The Municipality of Residence listed for each signing elector must clearly identify the town, village or city where the elector's voting residence is located. For example, if the elector is a resident in the Village of Ashwaubenon, but their mailing address is Green Bay, use the Village of Ashwaubenon as the municipality of residence.
6. Do not abbreviate your municipality of residence. For example, writing "EC" for Eau Claire, "LAX" for La Crosse, or "Milw." Milwaukee, will disqualify the elector's signature line.
7. The circulator may add any missing or illegible address or date information related to the elector before the papers are filed.
8. If any portion of the elector's line is partially completed or left blank, it will be disqualified. The same goes for the Certification of the Circulator.
9. You may not fax or email the nomination paper to the campaign. The original paper itself must be mailed to the campaign. Even if not all 10 elector lines have been filled out, return a partial sheet with a completed Certification of Circulator. Every signature counts!
