Connection Groups and their **faithful leaders** continued to mature all the while **providing care for over a 100 members**. The *Band of Brothers* Men's ministry team held an **Advance** in Palomar Mountain and a monthly **Guys & Grub** breakfast. The **USGirls Women's Team** hosted **events and a Fall retreat and conference** in Anaheim.

We began a series of **Core Classes** including *God Provides, Conflict Resolution and Pointing People to Faith*. We also began our quarterly **All Together Now!** church-wide potluck and celebration at The Venue.

KATHI ALLEN SOUTHWEST CHURCH PLANTING

Southwest Church Planting (SWCP) enjoyed its **third year of ministry** as a church planting center hosted by Chorus Church in partnership with the Christian and Missionary Alliance. **Our purpose is to gather, encourage, support and train leaders to plant healthy reproductive churches**. We do that through assessment centers, church planter gatherings (Forums), training, coaching and most of all... friendship.

2010 was a year of change and great growth for SWCP. Dave Reynolds became the director of SWCP when Jim Boyd answered the call to become a church planter. Kathi Allen, whose been working with SWCP since the beginning, came on staff as Administrator, Gary Comer now oversees coaching and Eric Oleson is the Assessment Center Director.

In 2010 we moved the **Forums**, our bimonthly training and support meetings, from their Riverside location to The Venue, decreasing Forum costs and increasing our ability to minister to church planters. Forums have more than doubled in size.

Ministry to C&MA church planters is growing and deepening as we work towards having an encouraging coach come alongside each planter. We've also experienced great growth and partnership with planters and church leaders from a wide variety of denominations. Participation in the four-day intensive **Church Planter Assessments** has increased and we now have waiting lists. We've also been asked to consider extending the reach of Southwest Church Planting to other locations including Arizona.

We look forward to what God is going to do in 2011. **Thank you to Dave, Chorus Church and the Christian and Missionary Alliance** for being so Kingdom minded. Leaders are being encouraged. Churches are being planted. People are being reached.

JOSH AXENE MEXICO MISSION

2010 was a great year for our Mexico Mission! In June, about **30 people went to Ensenada** where we built **two complete homes** for families in need, teamed up with Every Generation Ministries to run an amazing **Vacation Bible School** program for the kids in the village, and served hand in hand with John and Arlene at **Agua Viva Children's Home**.

By God's grace and through the generosity of many people in and beyond our church, **we raised nearly \$25,000** which was used to fund this ministry and to see God change many lives — both in Mexico and within our team. In 2010 we were able to **fill the freezers 3 times** (including our Christmas Care Project).

In 2011 we hope to fill the freezers four times, build at least two houses, and see more people come to Christ!

2010 ANNUAL HIGHLIGHTS

In your hands is a **quick summary of some of our 2010 ministry highlights**. This has been a very good year for our church in many ways. We were able to **baptize over 30 people**, minister to **hundreds of people** in and beyond our church, **double the size of The Venue**, **launch a young adults service**, start **new groups** for women and men, host 50-60 **church planting leaders** every other month through Southwest Church Planting, and **much more!**

We have seen Chorus move forward in leadership. Dan Allen came on as our **Elder Chairman** and is doing a terrific job. We have been able to add **new elder leadership** and also begin training **elder apprentices** for the future. This makes our church so much stronger.

PASTOR ERIC BEEMAN WORSHIP

More than 60 people attended our 3 day **School of Worship** training sessions hosted in our new offices. Sessions included workshops hosted by our very own talented musicians as well as guest artists from Churches around the valley. The weekend concluded with a concert featuring our Youth Band, Worship Band and The Justin Fox Band.

Concerts hosted at The Venue included *Nathan Tasker, Skyler Day, Loudhouse, Steve Bell* and a Mexico Mission Outreach concert led by members of our youth band, as well as a *Nite of Worship* hosted by the Rocky Road Group. The Venue was also rented out for recitals and a new church plant weekly team meeting.

A new Sunday night service, **Sunday Nites @ The Venue**, launched in September. Through this service we've seen many come to know the Lord. We've also seen a new community of Young Adults emerge through a **college study** that meets after the service.

We participated in **Families that Soar**, a conference that united more than 35 local churches and church leaders with the goal of strengthening families in the Temecula Valley. Over 700 people were in attendance. Also, several of our musicians participated in a city-wide worship night, **Gospelfest '10**, at the MERC and team members helped lead worship for our **Southwest Church Planting forums**.

We said goodbye to Tech and Band Leaders Andi Waldrop and Mike Burt and almost simultaneously said hello to Tim Pinkard (Techy) and Trevor Shultz (Drummer).

Financially, God has shown His faithfulness. We now have a **strong financial team** in place under the leadership of Treasurer Andy Sunderland. With expenses last year of \$540,798, we had income of \$542,256. To put it simply, with a half a million dollar budget, we were **\$1,458 to the positive!** And Chorus supported God's work throughout the world (The big "C" Church) in missions and church planting by giving approximately \$30,000 to our denomination, The Christian & Missionary Alliance. God is faithful, and I'm grateful for **your faithfulness to Him**.

Of course, **the best part of our church is you all**. Thank you for being part of the Chorus family! I'm grateful I get to serve with you. We look forward to seeing God work in and through all of us in 2011!

In 2010 we continued to move toward more **accessibility to information** and greater use of **social media**. We saw great community response from our **permanent signage** including new signs on our offices and The Venue. (City codes have required us to remove street billboards recently but we are pursuing other publicity and sign options).

Communications provided **graphic support and marketing** for 6 message Sunday series: *Real Love, God Gets It, Famous Last Words, Changed, Jesus in 3D, and Christmas 2010*—as well for Fall and Spring kick-offs, Easter and Christmas Eve outreaches, Mexico Mission, Men’s & Women’s Ministries and retreats, groups, youth, Momease, USkids and Welcoming Ministry, Core Classes (and assorted goodies like this Annual Report!) as well as for Sunday Nites @The Venue launched in September. Also, invites and posters were created to promote concerts @The Venue.

52 unique weekly **Sunday morning and Sunday Nite programs** were designed, printed and distributed to help provide information and inspiration for our guests. Our amazing **office volunteers** Janis Harris, Michele Henke, and Mel & Marilou faithfully printed and stuffed programs with guidance from office manager, Wendy Carlson. An **e-newsletter** was sent out weekly to our entire database, highlighting Pastor Dave’s updates.

Jessica Galbreth provided regular **website updates** as well as **new signage, and women’s and momease tee shirts**. We saw many guests begin their journey to Chorus from these outreach tools. Daniel Reynolds created tasty **video series “bumpers”** and Grant Reynolds expertly assisted with **digital designs**.

The Chorus **Facebook Page** continued to be updated and furthered developed to include a Groups and Events page and a new separate FB page for The Venue. Mike Hooper provided helpful social media consultation.

SUE BUSHROW USKIDS

Many new volunteers were added to USkids in 2010, including Middle & High School Students! We’re grateful for all our volunteers who are committed each week to make a difference in kid’s lives for Jesus sake. Thank you . . .you are the heart and soul of the USkids at Chorus!

Summer Sizzlers, our summer USkids program, blew the doors off Sundays! Middle School & High School students led the charge alongside a committed team of adults—**over 35 volunteers** with many new kids each week! Best summer yet! And 20 kids attended **Super Summer Camp** and 3 made decisions to accept Jesus. Cathy Schroeder was added to the USkids staff to assist in children’s ministries.

New Preschool lessons was piloted from Every Generation Ministries with the help and organization of Kim Willard. And **new Elementary curriculum** was piloted for the first time in the United States here at Chorus (written by our own teachers Joe & Julie Cox). Our curriculum taught our 1st-5th graders chronologically through the Bible with a focus on “Heart Transformation” and was also used at the VBS with our Mexico Mission. Our USkids averaged **135 kids each Sunday**. Dozens baptized!

Both children and adults participated in our **Christmas Care Project** that gave 8 families in need a Christmas dinner plus a full gift basket, many from our Kids Hope outreach.

Our **Kids Hope** mentoring program at LVES continued on in it’s 4th year under the leadership of Teri Davis.

The Groove (4th-5th grades) and it’s amazing volunteer team led by Dawn Graves, organized many events for this growing group, including movie nights, swim parties, and a Winter camp.
