Background:

Where Angels Play Foundation announces; "The Sandy Ground: Where Angels Play" project, which launched in Sea Bright, NJ March 1st, will now be making its way to Ocean City, NJ. This program was founded and created by the NJFMBA, and was inspired by playgrounds built by our organization after Hurricane Katrina in 2006.

This playground will reflect the life and personality of Benjamin Wheeler, a student who tragically lost his life on December 14, 2012 at Sandy Hook Elementary School. This is the 22nd playground of The Sandy Ground Project.

John Murphy, president of FMBA Local 27, Ocean City fire fighters and City staff are working with the Where Angels Play Foundation and local businesses to bring the project to Ocean City.

Inspired by senseless violence in Newtown, Connecticut and in an effort to restore the storm ravaged east coast after Hurricane Sandy, we endeavor to create 26 living tributes to the lives lost at Sandy Hook Elementary School as well as all children who have been victims of violence while creating safe, fun places for children to be children.

May these playgrounds provide a symbol of hope, recovery and a return to normalcy, a gift to our youth in an effort to enhance and sustain their precious childhood.
