
## Our Impact

To date, in 2013, Kate's Club has:

- Provided grieving children with 14000 hours of support
- Welcomed 102 new members and their families
- Trained 76 new Buddies
- Taken 160 children to Camp Good Mourning
- Held 16 Clubhouse Days, 17 Park Bench support groups, 3 large outings, 3 advanced volunteer trainings, and 18 new family orientations

KC Connects brings bereavement support services and grief education to the Greater Atlanta community through:

- **Grief Education** - a 45-minute activity that engages participants in an interactive activity that normalizes grief feelings and teaches how to help those who are grieving
- **Support Groups:** a closed support group over the course of six weeks to support children and teens who have experienced the death of anyone close to them.
- **Grief Training for Professionals:** A training available for school counselors, social workers, education and other professionals.

We currently have partnerships with several KIPP schools, Drew Charter School and schools across Gwinnett and Rockdale Counties.
