Linda Allard hosting Alessandra Ferri

After only two years in the fashion industry, Linda Allard became director of design at Ellen Tracy where she devoted the remainder of her 40-year career. An avid cook, accomplished artist, and devoted gardener, Linda authored and illustrated *Absolutely Delicious! A Collection of My Favorite Recipes*. Gunn Memorial is fortunate to be one of many not-for-profit organizations that Linda supports, which extends to the American Ballet Theatre of which she is a Trustee.

Alessandra Ferri is considered to be one of the most important dramatic ballerinas of our time. Born in Milan, she began training at the school of Teatro alla Scala and continued at the Royal Ballet School in London. In 1980, Ferri won the prestigious Prix de Lausanne and joined the Royal Ballet where she was selected by Sir Kenneth MacMillan for leading roles in *Romeo and Juliet, Manon*, and *Mayerling*. In 1985, Mikhail Baryshnikov invited Ferri to join American Ballet Theatre where she danced as a principal until 2007. Ferri has been the recipient of numerous prestigious awards. Since retiring from the stage, she has been the Director of Dance Programming at the Spoleto Festival in Italy. In 2011, Ferri began work on an innovative dance/ theatre project entitled *The Piano Upstairs*, for which she has created the choreography and concept, and has collaborated with the esteemed Broadway writer, John Weidman. The premiere will open the Spoleto Festival in June and will feature Alessandra and Tony Award-winning actor Boyd Gaines in the lead roles.

Robert Couturier & Jeffrey Morgan hosting Barbara Paul Robinson

Paris native Robert Couturier's grand-scale design and décor projects span continents, commissioned by a Who's Who of the international power elite. His eminently livable creations are grounded in classical training and spiced with his own inimitable wit: he loves baroque music as well as Eminem. He acknowledges that he would not be able to live without sugar and has far too many suits. "The furthest job I have is Azerbaijan on the Caspian Sea, but I am happiest in our house with Jeffrey and our Shi Tzus." Jeffrey Morgan is an architectural historian and self-professed vigilante preservationist.

Barbara Paul Robinson worked as a gardener for Rosemary Verey at Barnsley House during a sabbatical from the leading international law firm, Debevoise & Plimpton, where she was the first woman partner. A hands-in-the-dirt gardener herself, she and her husband have created their own gardens at Brush Hill in northwestern Connecticut, which have been featured in articles, books and on television. A frequent speaker, Barbara has published articles in the *New York Times*, *Horticulture*, *Fine Gardening* and *Hortus*; she also has written a chapter in Rosemary Verey's *The Secret Garden*. Dixie & David De Luca hosting Vicky Ward

Dixie and David De Luca have enjoyed their home in the New Preston area for almost 15 years. The De Lucas are avid American furniture and folk art collectors and members of the Collectors Circle of the Winterthur Museum, in Wilmington, DE, where David is a Trustee. After 25 years in the corporate insurance business, Dixie pursued her passion for entertaining, working with event planner Colin Cowie. She currently devotes her full-time efforts to their active family life, serves as Trustee to the New York School for the Deaf, and still loves to entertain. David is Managing Director at a New York investment bank. He is also the gardener in the family!

Vicky Ward is the author of *The Devil's Casino*, the inside story of what happened at Lehman Brothers and why it failed. Ms. Ward has been a contributing editor to *Vanity Fair*, *Town & Country*, among other publications, specializing in investigative reporting. She has profiled, among others, Jill Kelley and her role in the David Petraeus affair, CIA agent Valerie Plame,

businesswoman Louise MacBain, Morgan Stanley, the late Bruce Wasserstein, counterterrorism expert Richard Clarke, the Getty, the Guggenheim, the Fairfield Greenwich Group (the Madoff feeder fund), Brooke Astor and Kate Moss. She is writing a book about the General Motors Building, the most expensive and coveted commercial real estate in the U.S. Ward is a weekly columnist for the *Huffington Post*, and a contributor to CNBC. Previously the executive editor of *Talk* magazine, her work has appeared in the *New York Times*, the *Financial Times*, the *London Times*, and the *Daily Telegraph*. A native Briton, Ward was the runner-up for the Catherine Pakenham Award in 1994, Britain's most prestigious award for young women writers. She holds a Master's in English Literature from Cambridge and has lived in New York City since 1997.

Holly Flor & Rudy Mangels hosting Dr. Henry Lee

Holly Flor and Rudy Mangels have had their home in Roxbury for 37 years. Former weekenders from New York City, they have been full-time residents for the past 20 years. They have been enthusiastic supporters of the Gunn Library since their children were small and went to Saturday morning story time. This is their fourth time hosting a Library Luminaries dinner!

Dr. Henry Lee is one of the world's foremost forensic scientists. His work has made him a landmark in modern-day criminal investigations. He has been a prominent player in many of the most challenging cases of the last 50 years and has worked with law enforcement agencies in helping to solve more than 8,000 cases. Dr. Lee's testimony figured prominently in the O. J. Simpson, Drew Peterson, and Kennedy Smith Trials, and in convictions of the Newtown "Woodchipper" murderer. Dr. Lee assisted in investigations of other famous crimes, such as the murder of Jon Benet Ramsey in Boulder, Colorado, the 1993 suicide of White House Counsel Vincent Foster, the death of Chandra Levy, the kidnapping of Elizabeth Smart, and the reinvestigation of the Kennedy assassination. Dr. Lee is currently the director of Forensic Research and Training Center and Distinguished Professor in Forensic Science of the University of New Haven. He has co-authored more than 40 books and is a recipient of 20 honorary degrees. Married for more than 40 years, Henry & his wife Margaret have two grown children.

Steven Fuchs & Brian Lancaster hosting A. J. Jacobs & Julie Jacobs

Brian and Steven enjoy their Ehrick Rossiter home, which they share with their two children Anna (8) and William (6), their rescue dog, Lucy, and frequent house guests. Brian is currently head of structured transactions, strategy, research and risk at RBS, and was formerly CIO at Wells Fargo, head of Securitized Products Research at Bear Stearns, and Senior Economist at the Federal Reserve and the Bank of England. Brian serves on several boards, has authored a couple of finance books and has been an adjunct professor at Columbia and NYU business schools. A.J. Jacobs is a humorist and Editor-at-Large at *Esquire* and author of four *New York Times* bestsellers, including *The Know-It-All. In 2010 came *My Life as an Experiment: One Man's Humble Quest to Improve Himself*, then *Drop Dead Healthy* in 2012, which was written on a treadmill desk and took about 1,200 miles. Jacobs also has written for the *New York Times, Entertainment Weekly*, *New York* magazine and *Dental Economics* magazine, one of the top five magazines about the financial side of tooth care. Anderson has balanced an international advertising career with Ogilvy, FCB and Digitas as a Creative Director with 15 Himalayan expeditions, guiding on the Seven Summits and in the Himalayas, most recently leading a group to the top of Everest in May 2010, Makalu, the world's fifth highest mountain, in 2011, and to

the top of Mt. Vinson, the tallest peak in Antarctica in 2013. He has enthralled audiences as a motivational speaker and leads 40 children annually up the six floor circular staircase at the Ruben Museum of Art's "Peak Experience," an overnight ascent of a simulated Everest in the heart of NYC. Anderson is currently finishing his fourth book, *Nine Lives*. He lives with his wife Margaret and children, Myles (15) and Phoebe (13), in Wilton, CT.

"Wild Bill" Donovan, Special Counsel to Governor Averell Harriman and Assistant to Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy. Ambassador vanden Heuvel is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and Chairman of the Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt Institute. In 2002, the Special Exhibits Gallery of the Franklin Delano Roosevelt Presidential Library in Hyde Park, New York, was renamed in honor of Ambassador vanden Heuvel, who also received the Four Freedoms medal on that occasion. In 2003 he received the Theodore Roosevelt Distinguished Medal. He is Chairman of Four Freedoms Park Conservancy, a memorial to President Roosevelt, built and open to the public after 40 years of effort.
