*The average time to solo ranges from 8-20 hours of instruction time

The AeroSolo program¹ is designed around your schedule. Flight instructors are available seven days a week to help educate and guide you towards taking your first solo flight. There will be some students who simply want advanced training, while most will set a goal of solo flight.

People who decide to solo will register with the FAA to secure their student pilot certificate.² Many people will continue to train and advance to attain their Sport, Recreation or Private Pilot certificates. No matter what your goals, you will have fun, engage in a new learning experience and build new friendships that will last a lifetime.³

¹Enrolling in AeroSolo does not guarantee that solo flight will be attained.

²Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) rules require that people be 16 years of age to solo. There is no maximum age limit to solo an airplane.

³No one is ever required to purchase an aircraft to achieve flight certifications. Planes are always available to rent at your local airport. Planes for AeroSolo program are provided.
