### RABBI'S MESSAGE

Please join me in extending a mazel tov to Moshe Habshush and to his parents Amy and Aaron Habshush on the occasion of Moshe's Bar Mitzvah.

Haste makes waste, except when it comes to baking matzas. Indeed, the very essence of matzah is defined by speed. Matzas must be baked guickly. Eighteen

minutes from start to finish. One may not dilly dally even for a moment longer or the matzahs become chametz.

Chazal famously teaches that one must perform his mitzvos the same way he prepares his matzos. (In Hebrew the two words matza and mitzvah are differentiated only by a vowel.) Namely one must prepare the matzas with zrizus, alacrity and enthusiasm The implication therefore is that any mitzvah done without zrizus is compared to chametz.

R Yochana Zweig suggests that the metaphor of chametz and matzah to mitzvah observance speaks powerfully to the human condition. The more a person delays and procrastinates, the more a person can develop a reluctance and resentment to the task at hand, in this case a mitzvah. This resistance can develop into full fledged loathing. Therefore, Chazal refer to a mitzva performed without alacrity as chametz.

On the other hand, if a person performs a mitzva enthusiastically, he may come to love the performance of that mitzva, even if he has no love for it right now. Therefore, Chazal charges us to treat our mitzvas like we prepare our matzas, with speed, alacrity and enthusiasm.

When we begin our adult journeys in Judaism, we often do so with great zrizus. That enthusiasm tends to wane over the course of time. Let us remember as we celebrate with the Bar Mitzvah this Shabbos, how once and again we can experience the Torah with the enthusiasm of a Bar or Bas Mitzvah just beginning his or her journey.
