The 2014 Texas 4-H Dairy Judging Contest will once again be held in conjunction with the Fort Worth Stock Show and Rodeo Dairy Judging Contest. It is scheduled for Sunday, January 19, 2014 at the Will Rogers Memorial Center Cattle Arena.

The contest will be open to senior Texas 4-H members. There will not be a qualifying contest required at the District level. There will not be a state-level contest for Juniors or Intermediates. However, they are welcome to participate in the Fort Worth and/or possible District-level contests.

Senior 4-H teams wishing to compete in the Texas 4-H Dairy Judging Contest will need to register through BOTH Fort Worth Stock & Rodeo AND through 4-H Connect. There will be no onsite registration.

Do you have a special talent like singing, dancing, playing a musical instrument or acting? Then the Share-The-Fun contest may be just for you! A NEW acting category has been added this year called DRAMEDY! Here is the category description: A dramedy (also known as a comedy-drama or comedic drama) is an act that combines elements of comedy and drama, having both humorous and sometimes serious content. Acts cannot incorporate 4-H related material or theme. (Otherwise, it would be categorized as Celebrate 4-H.) Skits can be currently available scripts, original material, or a combination of the two. Humor and creativity are encouraged, but the degradation of any individual or organization is not permitted. May incorporate music, vocal selections, and/or choreographed routines, but these aspects cannot be more than half of the performance.

The other six categories remain the same: Celebrate 4-H, Choreographed Routines, Poetry/Prose, Musical/Instrumental, Solo/Band Performance, and Vocal. TEXAS STATE PRESERVATION PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST FOR 4-H AND FFA MEMBERS

The Texas State Preservation Board in partnership with the Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program are pleased to present an annual photography contest for members of the Texas 4-H and FFA Programs. This photography contest allows 4-H and FFA members to showcase Texas Agriculture through photos.

A select number of the photographs will be displayed in the Texas State Capitol Agriculture Museum starting in January 2014. Selected photographs will feature a place card with the photographer's name, city, and age. Photos will remain on display for one year in the Agriculture Museum.

The deadline for entering the contest on-line is October 15, 2013 and will be done through the Texas 4-H website, **texas4-h.tamu. edu.** For more information and rules & guidelines, go to the Texas 4-H photography website.

TAKE THE NATIONAL ROCKETRY CHALLENGE!

It's time to form your own rocket team and learn to fly. Registration is now open for the 2014 Team America Rocketry Challenge (TARC), the world's largest rocket contest where students compete for \$60,000 in prizes and scholarships. Participation is open to the first 1000 teams who register by December 1, 2013.

The 4-H team from Georgetown, Texas won first place in TARC this year and also won in the international competition in Paris to become the world champions! 4-H has always done well in TARC and had six teams make it to the finals with Mundfordville, Kentucky coming in seventh and Michigan's Deford Dazzlers finishing fourteenth nationally. The other 4-H teams attending were groups from Jamestown, NC, Palos Verdes Peninsula, CA and Clayton, MO.

The 2014 challenge is to design, build and launch a model rocket containing two raw eggs that reaches an altitude of 825 feet, stays aloft for 48 to 50 seconds, and returns the eggs unbroken by parachute. The team's qualification entry flight must be launched by March 31, 2014. If your score is one of the 100 best, you will be invited to compete for a share of the prize package in the national fly-off on May 10, 2014 in Manassas, Virginia.

Students in grades 7-12 in any U.S. school or non-profit youth organization are eligible to compete. About 7,000 students from across the country take part in the event each year, and since TARC's first contest in 2003 over 60,000 students have taken the challenge. Your group can do it, too.

Aerospace Industries Association (AIA) sponsors the contest with the National Association of Rocketry (NAR), the Defense Department, and AIA member companies. NAR http://nar.org/ is a 4-H partner and specifically invites 4-H groups to try rocketry and get into TARC.

This rocket contest gives future engineers the opportunity to demonstrate their math and science skills by designing a real aerospace product. Texas 4-H recently completed the 2013 Texas 4-H Livestock and Equine Ambassador Short Courses. Our staff is really excited about what this year will bring and we are looking forward to working with the new classes of elite Texas 4-H youth. In total, 99 students were trained for these high-level leadership positions. Because of the programs' positive impact on communities, unique leadership development model and increasing recognition-many companies have stepped forward to support the effort. - As a group, the ambassadors have contacted 231,303 people over the course of the year.

TEXAS 4-H OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIPS APPLICATION NOW AVAILABLE

The 2014 Texas 4-H Opportunity Scholarship Application is now available at: http://texas4-h.tamu.edu/scholarships. Texas 4-H Opportunity scholarship can be applied for by any high school senior who has been an active Texas 4-H member for the past three of four years, a Texas resident, and a US citizen. Applicants must be planning on attending a Texas College or University to be considered for a scholarship.

The Texas 4-H Opportunity Scholarship Program provides scholarships in four different categories. Each scholarship category has its own requirements and criteria. It is up to the applicant to make sure that he/she clearly understands the requirements and completes the application in order to be considered.

- Baccalaureate Scholarships for students who wish to pursue a Bachelor of Science (BS) or Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree from an
 accredited Texas College or University.
- Technical Certification Scholarships for students who wish to pursue technical certification in a recognized and approved major/course of study and from an approved Texas accredited college listed in the scholarship packet.
- Collegiate Scholarships designated for former Texas 4-H members who have been graduated from high school for at least one year, and completed a minimum of 30 hours of college credit at a grade point average of at least 2.7. Some collegiate scholarships contain other award criteria. (See separate application and instructions).
- Courageous Heart Scholarships scholarships awarded to Texas 4-H members pursuing either a Baccalaureate or Technical degree
 that have overcome extreme obstacles related to medical, family, and/or education and remained an active member in both 4-H and
 school.

See the requirements related to each of these scholarships. The deadline for scholarships to be turned in to the county Extension Office will be set by each county office.









As a volunteer with the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service, you are our partner in ensuring the highest quality educational programming is taking place for our young people. Therefore, it is important that we gather information from you, our volunteers, on what activities you are leading such as club meetings, workshops, project trainings, project visits, fund raisers, community service, etc.

To make the process of reporting as easy as possible for our volunteers, the Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program has developed two options for reporting numbers. One method is through the Texas 4-H Volunteer Resource website, the other through the 4-H CONNECT system. You may use whichever system works best for you, which could be a combination of both; however, we ask that you please do not report the same numbers into both systems.

Because these numbers are significant in sharing with stakeholders the outstanding work our volunteers are accomplishing, you are asked to report your numbers in a timely method. A good rule to follow would be within 5 days of your meeting, workshop, or event.

To help you decide the best option to use, below is some information for each system:

Texas 4-H Volunteer Resource Website

- Anyone can report to this system, regardless if you are a screened and/or designated club manager/ project leader.
- System does not require a login.
- To report, go to: texas4-h.tamu.edu/volunteerres.
- Once at the site, go to the section called "Volunteer Reporting."
- Beside "4-H Volunteer Reporting," click the link.
 This will take you directly to the on-line reporting system.

Texas 4-H CONNECT System

- To report using the 4-H CONNECT system, a volunteer must have access to their 4-H club(s).
- This includes your County Extension Office providing both access to your club(s) and the passwords for the club(s).
- To report, go to: texas4-h.tamu.edu/volunteerres.
- Once at the site, go to the section called "Volunteer Reporting." Select the link to the 4-H CONNECT system.
- Log into your family and once in the family profile, log into your club.
- Once in your 4-H Club area, you will click on the "Meeting Attendance" icon.
- Complete all applicable information for the club meeting and/or project training completed.


