G.O.A. Property Update

Vaughan Rezoning

The Owners' Group is still awaiting the decision by the MTO which has been delayed until at least the end of 2013, on the location and land required for the new major Highway, North of Kirby Road. Until then all development is on hold.

Hwy 400 Widening Expropriation

The MTO made the G.O.A a final offer of \$78,140 plus interest plus all costs. We have instructed the lawyer to accept this offer rather than proceed to an OMB hearing, which could have further delayed the compensation, without a guarantee of success and may have resulted in additional costs to the Association. The final settlement with interest should be approximately \$84,500 off which we have previously accepted \$41,000. The documentation has been submitted to the MTO and we are awaiting the final payment.

Greenbelt

As soon as the MTO has released the land for development, the Landowners Group is being represented by the Humphries Group Planning Consultants assisted by Beacon Environmental will commence the Block Plan phase, during which we will endeavour to adjust the Greenbelt Boundary in our favour, which is essential to permit viable development outside the Greenbelt after the Expropriation.

The Best Use Report received from the Humphreys Group has identified several options for development possible within the Greenbelt, including existing residential, Veterinary Facilities, Greenhouses and Recreational. These will be our guide to obtain future development planning approvals with would assist in selling the land. This cannot be started until we know when the land is being released by the MTO, which has now been pushed back to 2014.

Contributors' Mortgage Bond Redemptions

The AGM approved redemptions to the amount of \$30,000 plus any compensation received from the MTO less \$20,000 for future development needs. Redemptions by a draw will commence on receipt of the MTO compensation or in November whichever is earlier

The Goan Overseas Association (G.O.A.) is a strong integrated cultural organization that seeks to preserve the Goan identity and develop a wider appreciation of Goan culture locally throughout the GTA and worldwide. The organization will continue to actively maintain family, culture and tradition through social, cultural, athletic, and educational activities within the Goan community.

Ancestor's Trail

As Goans, our ancestry is of special pride to us. Whether it is our religious practices, our gastronomical experiences or our alcoholic preferences, we have been influenced to varying degrees by our immediate and extended ancestors.

For several hundred years, we were influenced by the Portuguese. This area of the Konkan coast was variously under Hindu, Bhuddist and Muslim influence going back to the first settlement of early humans who left Africa for greener pastures.

Our human evolutionary roots can be traced back to East Africa (National Geographic's "Genographic Project") but our common ancestry with other species is less known. Would it shock you to know that besides mammals, we have a common ancestry with all life on the planet going back some 3.5 billion years to the dawn of life? And why is this knowledge important today? Because many of the species we are dependent on for our wellbeing are going extinct due to man-made climate change. We are currently experiencing an unprecedented rate of species extinction.

Understanding our connection to other life on earth and acknowledging our interdependence is the first step towards taking positive actions to change our attitudes and actions. Towards this end, the concept of the 'Ancestor's Trail' was adopted here based on the book of a similar name written by evolutionary biologist, Richard Dawkins, called "The Ancestor's Tale".

The premise was to convey to participants the immense tract of geological time necessary for evolution to have taken which has resulted in the biodiversity we see around us today. Only the last billion years of evolutionary history was plotted along an accessible urban trail in Mississauga (from the dawn of multicellular life with each average stride equaling approximately 60,000 years!). Along this 12.5k route, markers were placed indicating our common ancestry with surviving life forms we recognize today. It is now known that all species of birds are survivors of one scion of dinosaurs that escaped extinction when an asteroid collided with earth 65 million years ago. Incidentally, all mammals on earth are also descended from one shrew-like progenitor that also escaped extinction at that time.

Starting at Erindale Park, the Culham trail is a well groomed urban hiking trail that, for the most part, follows the course of the scenic Credit River as it winds its way through Mississauga. Except for a small section in Streetsville, this tree covered trail allows hikers to cover 4 hours needed to complete the distance.

Progressing up the trail following our own evolutionary history brings us face to face with the history of how our own bodies evolved.



Slimy, eel-like hagfish have a skull to protect their brain but lack a spine, which leaves the nerves susceptible to damage. Cartilaginous fish like Sharks and Rays have a protected spinal cord and a streamlined body built on a frame to support muscles that allows coordinated and precise movements and sensory organs. Bony fish, that are a staple in Goa, allowed better protection of the brain and spinal cord that supplied the segmented body with sensory and motor innervations while lung fish, including the archaic coelacanth, went beyond gills to breathe air directly in dry conditions including the transitional land-fish famously known as Tiktaalik. Amphibians, like the bull frogs that are being harvested to extinction in the Goan paddy fields, made the transition to partially live on land and used their modified fins as appendages to support their weight. They gave rise to the reptiles and dinosaurs that, although cold blooded, thrived in all ecological niches on earth. Various extinction events were explained on the hike as the

trail got more exciting and the hikers got more tired. Rest stops provided some much needed respite from the oppressive heat and humidity which plagued the day but eventually the hike ended with a much appreciated barbeque lunch in a beautiful treed park off the Credit River in Streetsville. As an added bonus, participants were treated to a live display of large snakes by the owner and staff of the Squamata reptile store in Streetsville.

Eventually, to give the participants an idea of how much time humanity has graced this planet, a time line of the last 6000 years of recorded history (beautifully illustrated in a 16 foot fold-out chart) would have occupied just 6.5cm of the 12.5k trail! And to think, in this short while, we have plundered this planet with our lust for technology and trinkets. As has happened in the past, 99.99% of all species that ever evolved have gone extinct. There is no reason to think that humans will be the exception but let it not be said that it happened on our watch.
