Please do not decorate:

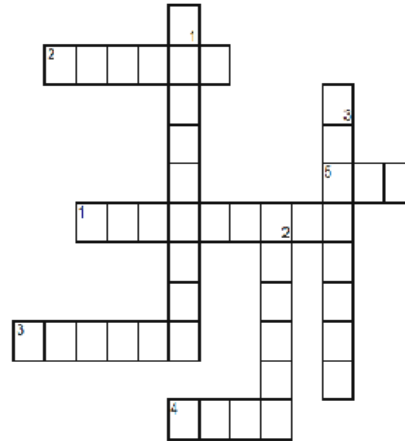
- ◆ The poles between the doors
