

Virginia's photo ID law goes into effect on July 1, 2014

When voting, you will need to show one of the following forms of photo identification:

- Valid Virginia Driver's License or other photo ID issued by Virginia
- Valid United States Passport
- Any photo ID issued by the local, state or federal government
- Valid student ID that has a photograph and that was issued by any institution of higher learning in Virginia
- Valid employee identification card that has a photograph and that was issued by the employer in the ordinary course of business



* Expired IDs are considered valid

Don't have a photo ID?

You can get a FREE voter identification card from a registrar's office in **THREE** easy steps:

STEP 1: Find a registrar

You don't have to visit the registrar's office in your locality; if a different location is more convenient for you, feel free to go there.

STEP 2: Go to the registrar's office

The hours for each office vary – be sure to check that your office is open before visiting.

At the office, you will:

- Fill out the *Voter Photo Identification Application*

Be sure to include the **last four digits** of your **social security number**, **birthdate**, and **signature** or your application will not be processed.

- Get your picture taken

- Give the registrar your electronic signature

STEP 3: Receive your photo voter ID card

You should receive your card in the mail within 7-10 business days. If you **don't**, call the State Board of Elections at (800) 552-9745.

NOTE: If you are a NEW voter, you will need to register to vote before you can get your voter

identification card. If you are not yet registered, the registrar's office will provide you with a voter registration application that you may complete and turn in before having your picture and signature captured for your ID card. Your ID will be mailed to you after your registration is processed.

*If your name or photo no longer match what is on your current ID, you are eligible to receive a free Voter ID.
