Course Description:

Dr. Howard Thurman was a guide and mentor for Martin Luther King Jr. and many others in the struggle for freedom, justice, and civil rights. His work speaks directly to today's personal and social issues, highlighting the powerful connection between spirituality and social transformation. A renowned author, educator, and preacher, Thurman co-founded the nation's first interracial interfaith congregation.

Through readings, discussion, audio and video resources we will explore the relevance and implications of his wisdom for contemporary times, and consider the practical applications of the principles presented for each participant's life journey, with a particular focus on the intersection between mysticism and social change.

The Friday night session may be taken as a "stand alone" introduction for those wishing to learn more about Howard Thurman, or as part of the full weekend workshop.

Please Note: Attendance on Friday is a prerequisite for the Saturday session, however some exceptions may be arranged with instructor permission. The ILM office can provide my contact information as needed.
