NFTY-SAR HATIKVAH KALLAH IS COMING TO CHARLOTTE MARCH 8-10TH



NOTES FROM THE CANTOR



Confluence, Communities of Practice and Coffees: Building Community for Young Families and Young Adults at Temple Beth El

Sometimes the most exciting opportunities seem to fall from the skies, as if from the heavens. While I have always been a shaper of my own destiny, sometimes opportunity presents itself when you least expect it, and all you need to be is open and creative enough to take advantage of what does happen your way. This was certainly the case for me when I came to Charlotte in 2003 planning to "take a year off" while Matt took a new job. Little did I know

that by coming to Charlotte I wasn't taking time off from becoming a cantor, but probably securing my future career in a way I never could have imagined. That move was *bashert* - destined from on high - and one of the reasons I know that God works in very mysterious ways.

While it is too early to compare my first move to Charlotte to the impact my new project will have on my life, I am beginning to get an inkling we might have set our toes into something amazing.

A few months ago, Rabbi Judy suggested that I start working with TBE Tots, since, God-willing, Matt, Johannah and I will welcome a little boy into our family at the beginning of May — placing us squarely as a young family for six more years.

Within weeks, two other major opportunities presented themselves, creating the perfect storm of potential for major cultural change in our community. First, PJ Library has come to Charlotte! PJ Library provides every family with Jewish children under age eight with an absolutely free children's book once each month regardless of affiliation. In every community where PJ Library exists, unaffiliated families are brought into the warmth of the community around reading and Jewish ideas. If you have a Jewish child, grandchild or know a Jewish child in your neighborhood, make sure that they are registered for PJ Library. It's free, it's fun and it has the potential to build Jewish identity and Jewish community. (Sign up now.)

The second opportunity to knock was the announcement of the URJ's inaugural round of Communities of Practice (COP). These Communities are created around synagogue issues in need of revisioning, bringing together congregations from across the country to work collaboratively. TBE is participating in the 18-month COP on Engaging Young Families. The talented Jena Coen traveled with me to Chicago at the end of January to begin this dynamic process.

We are in the earliest stages of work, but we are dreaming of a Temple Beth El Young Adults and Young Families Community where the fluidity of young adulthood into young parenthood is honored and explored. What we realized is that NextDOR (our 20s/30s group) and TBE Tots each has fantastic strengths, but both still have far to grow in terms of how they help participants create rich and meaningful relationships, which we know are the foundations of Jewish lives. We are reaching out slowly, to anyone who will listen, to help us envision TBE's Young Adult/Young Families Community of the future. This project has the potential to help us partner with those who seek more connection, and to create something that can profoundly impact people's lives.

Roz Greesnpon and Marty Birnbaum, recognizing the importance of creating community for this demographic, have established a fund to provide resources needed for this initiative. As each generation steps to the fore in the Jewish community, those first steps of creative engagement have almost always been funded by donors from outside the generation itself, those who see the need to invest in the future of the Jewish community. Such is the case with Harold

Grinspoon, the founder of PJ Library, as it is the case with our own March 2013 Volume 4 Roz Greenspon and Marty Birnbaum Young Families and Young Adults Fund.

While I do not know where this change process will ultimately take our community, I do know our hopes. We imagine a time where you might overhear young Jewish adults in the coffee shop, reflecting that Temple Beth El has helped them to create meaningful Jewish friendships; that their community - with kids or without them - is at Temple Beth El; and that Jewish connection is seeping into their homes at story time, at Shabbat dinner and every day. We are preparing to celebrate Pesach, gathered with those we love around Seder tables, one of the statistically most observed Jewish rituals in America. We love Pesach because we long to come into intimate contact - around food and in comfort - with those with whom we share our lives. When we help people build Sacred Connections, the rest will follow.

As part of our ongoing 70th birthday celebrations, Temple Beth El will dedicate the weekend of May 17-19 to celebrating the many acts of loving kindness shared amongst our congregants and the greater Charlotte community. In a special 7:00pm service on May 17th, "A Culture of Caring - Celebrating the Quiet Moments of Healing," we will feature several congregants who have been on both the giving and receiving ends of congregational support.

CREATING A JEWISH LEGACY - WHAT BETTER BIRTHDAY GIFT?

Temple Beth El's CJL (Creating a Jewish Legacy) team is pleased to report that we have obtained nine new legacy gifts this past month! Every one of these gifts was made by TBE members who expressed the same sentiment—"I want to make sure that future generations of Jewish children and adults can enjoy the same wonderful services and support that my family has enjoyed."

What makes the CJL program different? Simply put, a legacy gift is received after the donor or donors have passed away. A legacy gift requires no "payment" while the donors are alive. Thus, donors do not have their standard of living affected.

There are several ways that a legacy gift can be designed: For example, a life insurance policy designating TBE as the beneficiary, a direct gift from an IRA or 401(K), or a gift annuity. Distributions to Temple Beth El from a retirement plan such as an IRA or 401(k) has excellent tax advantages for the donor. A gift annuity is also an excellent way to make a gift and receive income every year several times larger than current money market or CD rates. Depending on your age, you can currently receive more than 7% a year from a gift annuity!

Abby Sherman doesn't cry at drop-off anymore. The biggest issue these days is whether to take the stairs or the elevator. Instead of tears now, Abby has her routine. She takes off her jacket. They do the hug. Dad gets a fist pump. Abby hits the ground running, usually going after the "table toys." Sound familiar? Most par-

ents know drop-off. How their kids used to dread it. And the fact that they don't anymore speaks volumes for CJP. For Abby's dad, Allen, and her mother, Suzy, CJP is more than just a place with "no more crying anymore." They cherish the Judaica piece, how Abby "knows more Hebrew than I do." How she knows the prayers and wants to do Ha'motzi over the challah. Suzy loves the interaction Abby is learning...and cherishing. Suzy says, "She blossoms there." And Suzy doesn't say things lightly. And, it's not just about Abby. Her parents have met friends here and enjoy the sense of community, too. They connect with other people who have children the same age.

Abby has a hard time leaving each day. She ropes mom or dad into pushing her on the swing on the new playground. One push becomes two...two become three...and so on. So, the days when drop-off was the hard part seem long gone in the Sherman household. And probably at many other CJP homes, too. Now, getting the children to leave school...is the challenge.
