On Thanksgivukkah

It was last year around this time when many in the Jewish world first started taking note of a most unexpected of mash-ups to occur on the 2013/5774 calendar: Thanksgiving + Chanukah. I remember remarking, "The first

candle is on Erev Thanksgiving! How bizarre!" What I, and the vast majority of my friends, family, and colleagues, did not realize last year, was that Thanksgiving + Chanukah = Thanksgivukkah, a once in a lifetime celebration of "Light, Liberty, and Latkes."

With much digital ink spilled and media minutes spent, Thanksgivukkah has taken the Jewish - and non-Jewish world - by storm. Stephen Colbert, in his usual satirical style, has gone down the rabbit hole of Thanksgivukkah. Articles exploring the phenomenon of the menurkey (yes, that's a turkey-shaped menorah, the brain-child of a nine-year-old) and what will surely be amazing meals filled with sweet potato and pumpkin latkes or sweet potato bourbon noodle kugel are peeking out from behind every digital corner. Clever ideas for decorating include cornucopias filled with chocolate gelt.

Thanksgivukkah is exciting for its novelty. This is only the second time the holiday combo has occurred since observance of the American Thanksgiving holiday in the mid-nineteenth century, and it's the only time it will occur for nearly 80,000 more years. It feels almost like Charlie Brown and the Great Pumpkin to me; Thanksgivukkah is REAL, if only for a moment!

But what can we learn from Thanksgivukkah? Well, the p'shat - the simple interpretation - seems to be that both Thanksgiving and Chanukah tell the stories of groups fighting for religious freedom. In both cases, we express our gratitude for the opportunity to partake of those freedoms. I think that relatively few Americans, Jewish or otherwise, spend much time thinking about the meaning of Thanksgiving these days. Much like Halloween, Thanksgiving has become a modern American holiday fairly distanced from its meaning of origin.

For Jewish kids and families, that might very well be a good thing, because it enables us to celebrate those holidays as Americans while doing fewer mental acrobatics to reconcile any inconsistencies with our Jewishness. Thanksgiving is simply a holiday about gratitude, family, and food; not another people's freedom story, nor the tale of conquering a new land.

What I'm really interested to see this year is how the timing of Chanukah - almost a month before Christmas - impacts the feel of our December dilemma. Typically, Chanukah is readily subsumed in the culture surrounding Christmas in America, for better or for worse. But what of this year? We will be two candles into Chanukah before Black Friday even occurs. Will Chanukah's conclusion before the retail season is in full swing diminish the consumer culture of gift giving? Perhaps, this will be the year when we see Chanukah shake off some of the pressure of trying to hold its own ground beside Christmas? Perhaps this will be a year when Jewish Americans see Chanukah more clearly - as eight days of gratitude, family, and food?

I wonder still what will this change of dance partners feel like for our interfaith families? In my own family, where we have quite a few non-Jewish relatives, and in Matt's family, Thanksgiving was a safe zone, completely free of any of the things that divide us and just a time to be and enjoy one another. Will that particular freedom be lost this year as we infuse Thanksgiving with Chanukah? Will the distance between Chanukah and Christmas this year hurt or help those family and identity issues that crop up every year in December. Only time will tell.

What does seem most certain to me is that families will be together to celebrate Chanukah this year, gathered around their Thanksgiving tables, the chanukiah a welcomed addition. As we embark on this most unique festive season, I pray that we all find opportunities for gratitude and especially a little extra joy in the welcomed absurdity of Thanksgivukkah.

Temple Beth El holds an annual Inclusion Shabbat Service emphasizing a variety of issues surrounding building a truly inclusive community. Temple Beth El's LGBT advocacy group, the Keshet Committee ("Keshet" is Hebrew for Rainbow), sponsors this event to raise awareness and strengthen the bonds between our diverse congregants and community members. 




KRISTALLNACHT CONVERSATIONS - IMPROVE THE FUTURE, REMEMBER THE PAST
