# The Indoor Air Quality Association Manchester Chapter Presents: Biohazard Clean Up in the Indoor Environment

As environmental professionals diversify and add services to their portfolio, there is increased attention focusing on the specialized field often called Biohazard Cleanup (or alternatively described as BioRecovery, Crime Scene Cleanup, and Trauma Scene Cleanup). Remediation contractors and environmental consultants can perceive parallels and shared skills in this area with other services and expertise they already provide. But, there are aspects of biohazard cleanup that make this arena of infectious materials control and containment unique. Just because there are some similarities doesn't mean an environmental professional can jump into providing these services without education, training and preparation of workers for some unusual challenges.

Almost every public and private entity has to have a plan when blood or OPIM (Other Potentially Infectious Materials) are suddenly present among employees, residents and consumers. Such contingency plans necessarily incorporate the extent to which in-house staff can address these situations, and the point at which it is critical to employ specialized professionals to address the emergency at hand.

This session offered by IAQA is intended to both offer essential information on biohazard to every attendee. Simultaneously, the goal is sparking a discussion on this topic that brings a multitude of interested people together in an environment conducive to introductions and a better understanding of how attendees can engage to assist each other.
