Sustainable Energy Innovation Award – *Limestone District School Board*, Central Frontenac, Addington Highlands, North Frontenac, South Frontenac, Loyalist and Stone Mills, Town of Greater Napanee, City of Kingston and the Frontenac Islands

Kingston Hydro Conservation Award – *Queen's University- Kingston General Hospital Combined Heat and Power Plant – Demand Response 3 Program*, Kingston

Community Leadership Award – *St. Lawrence College*, Kingston
