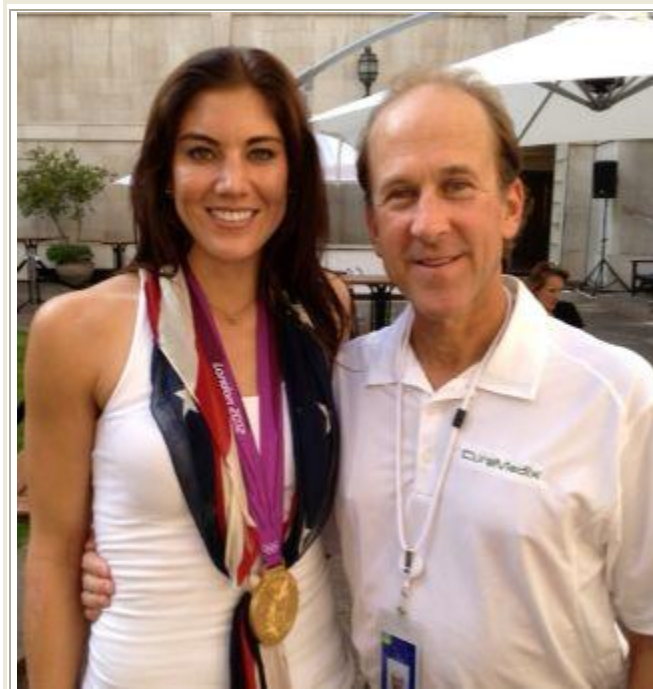


NY Podiatrist Uses EPAT to Treat Athletes at the Olympics
