active in his church by being a lector, Eucharistic Minister, a past chairman of the Finance Council, and a member. He served as a chairman of the Parents Teacher Association of the Polish Language School, which his daughter currently attends.

Dr. Herbert Jackson

Dr. Herbert Jackson was born in Cook County Hospital in Chicago in 1930. He was raised in Chicago Public Housing complexes (Ida B. Wells) and graduated from Wendell Phillips High School in 1948. He was drafted into the U.S. Army in 1951 and served three years during the Korean conflict. He attended Woodrow Wilson Teachers College and received an associate of arts degree.

Dr. Jackson met his wife of 54 years, Edna Counts, while attending Wilson Junior College. They have two children.

Dr. Jackson completed his bachelor of science degree at Chicago State University. After working a few years in various jobs such as Chicago Elementary School System teacher, *Chicago Tribune* newspaper (Circulation Department), and Cook County Sheriff's Department as a deputy sheriff, Dr. Jackson attended Illinois College of Podiatric Medicine and graduated in 1962. While in podiatry school, a friend mentioned Rockford was the second-largest city in Illinois.

In April 1963, he met Dr. Jeffery Ish. He and Dr. Ish would later join a partnership and have their first office on Seventh Street in Rockford. Five years later, Dr. Jackson and Dr. Ish bought property on 11th Street to build a new office and operating room. He practiced podiatry and performed surgery for 38 years in Rockford, retiring in 2000.

Dr. Jackson has served on numerous boards such as Rosecrance, Winnebago County Health Department and Wesley Willows Nursing Home, to name a few. He is a member of the American Society of Podiatric Medicine, the National Society of Podiatric Medicine and the Illinois Society of Podiatric Medicine.

Danny McDade

Danny McDade was raised in Royal Oak, Mich., and graduated from Western Michigan University and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps. He completed Flight School and was designated a Naval Aviator in 1981 and assigned to flying helicopters. Danny joined a Reserve Marine squadron in1988, located near New Orleans, while working full time for Petroleum Helicopters flying to and from the oil rigs in the Gulf of Mexico.

He was placed back on active duty in 1990, when he deployed to Saudi Arabia and Kuwait in Operation Desert Shield/Storm.

In 1996, he returned to civilian flying with Lifeline Helicopter of Saint Anthony's Medical Center in Rockford. In 1997, he joined the Marine Forces Pacific in Hawaii and participated in multiple exercises deploying to Kuwait, Egypt and Korea before being mobilized for Operation Enduring Freedom and deployed for one year after 9-11.

In 2005, he was again mobilized in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and deployed to Multinational Forces Western Iraq. He again deployed in 2006-2007 to the 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing (Forward) in the Al Anbar Province of Iraq. He repeated that tour in 2008, after which he retired at the rank of colonel after 31 years of commissioned service with the United States Marine Corps. He again returned to civilian flying with REACT helicopter of Rockford Memorial Hospital, where he is currently employed.

Danny is a member of the local Marine Corps League, VFW and Military Officers Association of America. He was past president of the largest union of Emergency Medical Service Pilots in the world. He has personally transported well more than 1,300 injured or critically ill patients.

He has been married for 33 years to the former Mary McWethy of Kalamazoo, Mich. They have two sons.

Heavily influenced by his uncle's singing of Irish tunes at family gatherings, after retiring from the Marine Corps, he formed the music group Dannyboyz, which later became Gaelic Fury. They perform a variety of traditional jigs and reels, ballads and Irish pub tunes. His band has played in many venues around the Rock River Valley from pubs to festivals and private events.

Danny was a founding member and past president of the Rock River Valley Celtic Society, which put on two Irish Fests in Rockton. He currently serves on the Irish Marching Society's Board of Directors, organizing the annual St. Patrick's Day Parade and party for the Rockford area.
