#### • Items We Accept For Donation

The thrift boutique operates solely on donations. If you are cleaning out your closets, think of the JFCS Thrift Boutique! Items need to be clean and in good working condition. We accept clothing, household items, books, home décor, rugs, electronics, shoes, jewelry, toys, seasonal items, craft items, tools and more.

## • Items We Cannot Accept For Donation

It's hard to say "no thank you" to a donation. However, if an item is not in saleable condition, the costs handling or disposal diverts funds that would otherwise support our programs. Please dispose of these items through an alternative responsible resource.

Unfortunately, we cannot accept certain items including but not limited to:

- Items that do not work. JFCS Thrift Boutique cannot repair these items.
- <u>Building materials.</u> Carpet, shutters, doors, windows, toilets, lumber, concrete, bricks, stones. JFCS Thrift Boutique does not sell these items and disposal costs are restrictive.
- Encyclopedias. These items are not saleable in our stores and cannot be recycled.
- <u>Upholstered couches and chairs which are torn, soiled or otherwise damaged</u>. JFCS Thrift Boutique does not repair or clean items and can only offer clean, useable items for sale in the stores.
- <u>Automobile parts.</u> Tires, wheels, batteries, seats, body parts and engines. JFCS Thrift Boutique does not sell these items.
- Paint and chemicals of any kind. Kerosene and gas heaters and appliances.
- <u>Frequently recalled items.</u> Infant furniture, car seats, helmets, exercise equipment, baby cribs, strollers, carriages, playpens/play yards, children's items containing lead.
- No mattresses, beds, large appliances, or furniture.
- Water-soaked or stained items
- Promotional clothing items

Come to the JFCS Thrift Boutique to search for a fabulous find, a one of a kind item or a blast from the past! You will find our friendly volunteers and wonderful Store Manager ready to assist you.
