OUR HISTORY

In **1961** Sebastian "Pat" Grasso started ASI, then called Accessory Specialties Inc., on Astoria Blvd. in Queens, NY, as a selling agent for Cope Corporation. Little did Pat know that he had started what would eventually become the largest washroom accessories and telephone enclosures manufacturer in the world.

The company was started with two part time employees and one full time employee. That first full time employee, Charles "Charlie" LaBarbera, would eventually become the General Manager of ASI in 1975. Charlie continues to be the General Manager/ Senior V.P. of ASI today.

Soon after the company started, Pat brought in his brother, Joseph Grasso, as a partner in the firm. During **1964**, Cope Corporation, the manufacturing arm, was merged into ASI.

In **1967** the company outgrew its location and moved to a facility in the Bronx, NY.

By **1975** ASI had grown to more than 100 employees and had to move again to a 50,000 sq. ft. building in Hunts Point, NY. Growth continued and a second 20,000 sq. ft. facility was added in Peekskill, NY. By **1977** ASI had doubled its size at the Hunts point location, employing approximately 200 people.

In **1978**, ASI moved to its current world headquarters, in Yonkers, NY. At the time the manufacturing capacity at the facility was 85,000 sq. ft. with an additional warehousing capacity of 55,000 sq. ft. added later.



During these years ASI had grown to produce a wide variety of washroom accessories, hospital



products and telephone enclosures and other specialties products ranging from paper towel dispensers and commercial mirrors to medicine cabinets, nurse stations, hollow metal doors, subway display boards and even residential wall units marketed under the brand GSW.

In **1983**, ASI bought American Dispenser, a manufacturer of soap dispensers. American Dispenser was incorporated in New Jersey and was located in Carlstad, NJ employing forty-five people. Along with American Dispenser came the assets of Desert Ray Products, a

manufacturer of washroom accessories and hospital products similar to ASI - American Dispenser had acquired Desert Ray in 1972. Desert Ray Products was started in Texas in 1946 by Mr. Hirsch and operated in two facilities totaling 85,000 sq. feet.

In **1985** Moore Dispenser Corporation, a company established in 1890 by Samuel G. Moore as a soap manufacturer, was purchased by ASI as well. Moore Dispenser manufactured similar products as ASI. With roots in Wichita, KS, it had moved to Denver, CO, San Francisco, CA, New York, New Jersey and finally back to New York in 1984.

In **1985** with all these brands under the same ownership it was decided to launch an overarching brand, American Specialties Inc. as the single brand for the many different products that ASI was manufacturing and marketing. ASI had grown to become a resource for architects and contractors alike, providing expertise in writing specifications and assisting in the appropriate selection of products to meet the needs of any commercial building the world over.

In **1986** ASI added The Charles Ramsey Corporation, a manufacturer of grab bars, to its portfolio. At one point in time Ramsey not only made grab bars, but parts for the likes of Baldwin, Steinway and Omaha organs.

In **1987** the Rolla family purchased ASI from Pat Grasso. The Rollas already owned GEM industries in Georgia, Global Partitions, a Long Island, NY-based manufacturer of toilet partitions, and Accurate Partitions, a McCook, IL-based manufacturer of toilet partitions. Thus a new chapter in ASI's history had started. Growth had come organically and via acquisition until this point in time. The Rollas added a disciplined approach to take ASI to a new level of professional business management.

In 1993 ASI purchased Watrous Inc. in Canada to reach the growing Canadian market.

In **1996** ASI purchased McKinney Parker in Scranton, PA, another manufacturer of washroom accessories similar to ASI products.

In **2003** ASI completed construction of a state of the art addition to their existing warehouse in Yonkers. This addition was a 20,000 sq. ft., 50 ft. high warehouse adding 2,640 pallet locations to assist in the expansion.





Also in **2003** ASI began producing a variety of washroom accessories in Toccoa, GA.

In **2009** ASI built another warehousing facility, ASI West, to better serve the needs of our customers.

That same year ASI launched its newest collection, Roval™.

In **2009** ASI won the award for Business of the year in the city of Yonkers, NY.



OUR PROJECTS

ASI products have been a part of many prestigious projects around the world.

In 1976 when the original Yankee Stadium was renovated, ASI accessories were used. Consequently when the new Yankee Stadium was built in 2009, ASI accessories were once again used in the entire stadium.

When the original World Trade Center was built, ASI products graced the buildings. As the new Freedom Tower is built at that site, ASI accessories will once again be part of history.

ASI products have been used in every commercial construction project possible.

At our World HQ, in New York, ASI employees approximately 250 people, making it one of the largest private employers in the City of Yonkers, NY.

With four strategically located warehouses servicing the US, and additional warehouses in Canada and overseas, ASI is committed to having the right mix of products to serve our customers with *ease of doing business* as our primary goal. Our Canadian operation, ASI Watrous, services our northern neighbors from coast to coast.

In 2011 ASI, began offering its products as BIM objects to the construction community - proving once again that ASI is at the forefront of technology to meet the growing needs of our customers.
