action, fluting and skeletonizing and synthetic stock were all carefully designed to reduce weight without compromising performance.

Even though it is extremely light, the Mountain Ascent is anything but fragile. The stock is reinforced graphite to ensure rigidity and strength, and features a soft-touch texture that guarantees a positive grip regardless of environmental conditions. The action and barrel are machined from stainless steel for strength and corrosion resistance.

The spiral-fluted bolt with full-length Mauser claw extractor offers the unequaled performance of true controlled round



feeding and extraction. These features make the Mountain Ascent not just the lightest rifle available on the market, but also one of the most dependable.

Chambered in .308 Winchester, 270 Winchester, .280 Ackley Improved and .30-06 Springfield, the Kimber Mountain Ascent is an extremely versatile rifle. The straight comb stock combines with a 1-inch Pachmayr Decelerator recoil pad and muzzle brake to dramatically decrease both felt recoil and muzzle lift. Each Mountain Ascent includes a thread protector cap so that the muzzle brake can be removed for hunting (if desired) without risking damage to the threads.

When it comes down to light weight, accuracy and dependability, the Kimber Mountain Ascent is unparalleled. Put one in their hand, and your customers will agree.



New facility will increase production, range capacity

1911 pistols, Solo pistols and Mountain Ascent rifles.

This new facility will dramatically expand our factory and warehouse square footage, allowing us to create a more efficient process

flow from beginning to end. It will also multiply our range capacity and test throughput several-fold.

A look inside Kimber's newest and largest manufacturing facility, set to begin production later this summer.

As I write this dispatch, I can report that we have just completed our fit-out (albeit a bit later than planned) of this new plant, secured most municipal signoffs and have begun commissioning this state-of-the art manufacturing facility. We intend to fully occupy it later this summer.

In addition to this expansion, new suppliers have been added to the fold. Our Facebook fan base continues to engage and grow, new point-of-purchase pistol displays are being delivered to Master Dealers and our ecommerce store is currently undergoing a major overhaul which we expect to unveil early this fall.

We are well through our conversion to stainless steel barrels on most centerfire pistols. New 1911 models including the Master Carry family with Crimson Trace Master Series Lasergrips, an upgraded version of the Team Match II and the new Warrior SOC are now shipping. The original PepperBlaster (reintroduced this year) will be quick to follow.

Solo DC (Deep Cover) models —which feature a tough DLC slide finish, night sights and the Carry Melt treatment— will ship this summer, while delivery of our Micro .380 ACP has been shifted to Q1 2014. We are and will continue to work especially hard this summer to further improve order fulfillment rates across the board.

HELP KIMBER RIFLE CUSTOMERS

MAKE EVERY ROUND COUNT

Serious hunters want to be ready for the shot at the trophy of their dreams. With ammunition being in short supply, hunters purchasing a Kimber rifle for the upcoming season will appreciate suggestions that will help them sight in as efficiently as possible. The following tips will help them get the most from every squeeze of the trigger.

Start clean. Use a premium bore cleaning solution such as Shooter's Choice and follow the manufacturer's instructions to properly clean the bore. It is also a good idea to disassemble and clean the bolt at the same time.

Get it tight. Remove, degrease and then retighten the action screws. Attach bases after cleaning and degreasing both the screws and screw holes. Some may elect to use a locking solution that holds screws firmly in position.

Mount up. Turn the scope's windage and elevation adjustments to the mechanical center of their adjustment range. Clean and degrease the rings, then position them on the bases. Place the scope in the rings, snug them up and then use the gross windage screws on the rear base (if present) to horizontally bore sight the scope as closely as possible. After leveling the reticle, tighten the screws and then fine-tune the bore sight.

Settle down. Fire a fouling shot to remove any cleaning solution from the bore and to settle the scope adjustments. If the shot is not on paper at 100 yards, adjust the scope accordingly and fire additional single shots until corrected.

Three is key. Fire a three-shot group with the same point of aim and let the barrel cool three minutes between each shot. Completely clean the bore. Adjust the scope as necessary. Fire a fouling shot, cool and then shoot another group. Repeat until satisfied with the zero.

Hold on. Kimber rifles are light, and maintaining a proper shooting position from shot to shot is very important. The most consistent accuracy usually happens when the shooter holds the forend to prevent it from jumping out of the front rest. An alternative is to let the off hand ride on top of the scope.

Be cool. Kimber barrels are thin, so following the three-minute rule between shots is important. It is also a good idea to leave the bolt open between shots, shoot from a shaded rest and to keep ammunition out of direct sunlight.

There is no substitute for practice, but following these guidelines ensures a Kimber shooter will get the most from each session at the range.


USA Shooting Team continues to shine

Skeet shooter and two-time Olympic gold medalist Vincent Hancock

Skeet shooter and two-time Olympic gold medalist Vincent Hancock competes in the ISSF World Cup in Acapulco, Mexico.

2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro; and if the early results of 2013 are any indication, even greater success will follow in the years to come.

USA Shooting's World Cup season is off to a great start as the Team earned three medals in the first World Cup of the season in Acapulco, then continued on to Changwon, Korea. In Korea, the Men's Rifle Team featured three U.S. Army Marksmanship Unit (USAMU) stalwarts who demonstrated their skill—all finished inside the top 15 of an all-star field in the Men's 50m Prone Rifle event. Michael McPhail proved once again he's a dominant force in the sport, earning a silver medal despite tough weather conditions. McPhail has finished in the top five at the last three World Cup competitions.

Finally, the Team sent 12 representatives to compete in a shotgun-focused World Cup in Al Ain, United Arab Emirates. Led by Olympians Glen Eller and Frank Thompson, Team USA recorded several outstanding performances despite not medaling in any of the five events. In the new ISSF event format, Eller smashed the Double Trap world record, breaking 146/150 targets in qualifying to finish fifth overall while Brandy Drozd set a new World Junior Record with 71/75 targets in qualifying to finish 11th overall. Thompson managed a 12th-place finish in Men's Skeet despite dropping just three targets.

More competition remains in 2013 with USA Shooting's National Championships along with World Cups and a Shotgun World Championship that will identify the Olympic athletes with the drive to remain at the top of their game while identifying a new crop of young, developing talent.
