# "It's Good to Have Someone To Turn To"

"One day during a speaking tour, Albert Einstein's driver, who often sat at the back of the hall during his lectures, remarked that he could probably give the lecture himself, having heard it so many times.

Sure enough, at the next stop on the tour, Einstein and the driver switched places, with Einstein sitting at the back in his driver's uniform.

Having delivered a flawless lecture, the driver was asked a difficult question by a member of the audience. 'Well the answer to that question is quite simple', he casually replied. 'I bet my driver sitting in the back, there could answer it.'" (Taken from Good Stuff August 2013)

That is an interesting story to say the least. It reminds me that when we are unsure about something it is good to have someone reliable to count on for advice.

Surely the disciples could look to a number of occasions when Jesus, the Master Teacher provided just the right answer.

Perhaps you recall from Luke's gospel that Peter said, "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets. When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break." (Luke 5:6-7)

Again, Luke's gospel reveals that the disciples were overwhelmed at the sheer number of little children that parents were bringing to Jesus one day. Jesus provided just the right answer for his disciples that day. For Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these." (Luke 18:16)

Also, Mark's gospel tells of the day when Jesus and the disciples were out in a boat during the storm. The disciples became fearful and said, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?"

He got up rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet be still!" (Mark 4:38b-39)

I shared those passages with you as a reminder that we serve a Savior who not only has the answer, but who is the answer.

As you read through the gospels and witness the ministry of Jesus, take note of how he dealt with many of the same life-issues that we face and then do likewise.

As the title of the article implies <u>It's Good to Have Someone to Turn</u> To.

# Breakaway Bulletin by Beau Wilson

Change can be difficult, scary, and often the most tiring task we can undertake. Author Arnold Bennett describes this experience by saying, "Any change, even a change for the better is always accompanied by drawbacks and discomforts." Change is uncomfortable and even dangerous because it thrusts us into the unknown! However, the alternative is to remain stagnant and motionless until we realize we have built a cage around our lives to safeguard the things we once perceived to be important.

Breakaway has and is continuing to undergo drastic changes. We used to have one big gathering on a Sunday evening, but now, once a month we will be splitting up. We had typically met as one group during the education hour but now we'll have volunteers come and take a team that is split between either high school and middle school or between men and women. We also will have students, ones we've grown to know and care for, who are moving away. These changes can be painful, sad, and scary at times. The Bible tells us not to be afraid or dismayed (Joshua 1:9), that God will be with us during these changes (Deut 31:6), and that God created everything with a season (Eccl 3:1). Those verses give us great hope but do not remove the potential growing pains about to be experienced. Jesus tells His disciples in John 16 that it's good that He will leave. His disciples, but change we must. Jesus sends the Holy Spirit that can be everywhere, as opposed to keeping His earthly body. Dividing up groups between age or gender lines allows for more honest and vulnerable discussions. A student who moves away allows them to bring seeds to plant the Kingdom of God somewhere new!

I will leave you with a quote of hope from the novel, "The Alchemist" that reminds us to move daringly into the future and not to remain stationary. It reads, "We are afraid of losing what we have, whether it's our life or our possessions and property. This fear evaporates when we understand that our life stories and the history of the world were written by the same hand." May we remember that although change is scary, God is with us wherever we go.
