In a few words tell us about yourself:

We were married in 1965 after having met and dated at Illinois State University. We have 2 sons, 4 grandchildren & 1 great grand-daughter.

We are both retired teachers. Dick taught Industrial Arts and Jean taught 5th grade.

After retirement, we decided to upgrade from a pop-up trailer we towed behind a Honda Goldwing to a 1994 25 ft. Classic Excella Airstream. We then had room to carry Dick's RC airplanes in the truck and really were proud to own our 25 ft. Airstream. At the time we had a sweet 80 lb. chocolate lab, Buster, and had to learn to pass each other in the narrow trailer. We began to look for a 30 ft. Airstream with a slide. We now have a 2006 30 ft. Classic Airstream and really appreciate the room. (We had replaced almost everything in the smaller trailer so the new owners (would) enjoy the "like new" trailer.) We have built an 8 x 10 shed on our site in Green Valley, Arizona with work benches for Dick's airplanes and Jean's stained glass as well as the still needed storage. Buster is no longer with us but we have adopted Lucky, a Jack Russell/Maltese Terrier mix who we affectionately call a Jack Rascal. This larger "Twinkie" makes living in it for 5-6 months a lot easier. Number 1188 has been added to this "Twinkie".

After joining WBCCI Dick has served on the Board of Directors of the Northern Ill. Unit and Jean has served as secretary. We have taken several caravans and rallies as well As 2 International Rallies. Tech Time

This month's tech time is provided by Jim Kraner.

RV water tanks want to be disinfected at least once a year, if not more, especially when you have left water in the tank for a long time. Bacteria grows and develops into a rotten egg smell in the water. I find it best to drain all the water out of the tank and refill the tank with household bleach and fresh water. I pour 6 oz of bleach for a 40 gallon tank, right into the fill hose and attach it to the faucet and fill the tank. You can proportion the amount of bleach for your size tank. With the bleach in the hose you are also disinfecting the hose. Once the water tank is full, run both hot and cold water at the farthest faucet from the water tank until you smell bleach on your hand that's in the running water. Then go to the next farthest faucet and do the same, until all water outlets have had bleach through them, even the toilet. Let the bleached water in the system over night and then drain the tank and fill with fresh water and flush out the bleach water from each faucet. I also have a squirt bottle filled with bleach water and before I use a camp ground water source, I spray the faucet handle, hose attachment threads and my water hose attachment fittings to kill bacteria, especially the water sources that campers use to wash their dishes and sources close to a dump station.


