CONGREGATIONAL CARE MINISTRY

New Beginnings – Visiting Facility and Home Bound Members

The coaches of the Congregational Care Ministry are regularly asked how you can begin visiting someone who can no longer attend church. The numerous questions include how you begin a conversation, what do you talk about, how long should you stay and other general or individual concerns. Briefly, I'd like to walk you through what happens from when you make your first inquiry until you have finished your first visits.

The Congregational Care Ministry contains several active ministries. They will be explained so you can determine which one is best for you. Usually, this begins by your receiving a copy of our newsletter and inviting you to attend either a monthly meeting or bi-monthly luncheon to meet other members who are currently involved. One of the coaches meets with you individually, usually before or after one of these meetings.

If it is determined that you want to do Facility Visitation, you are provided with the two-page UMCSCC "Rules and Procedures," which contains basic information regarding church visitation as well as confidentiality requirements contained in the H.I.P.P.A. Law. This will briefly answer many of your questions.

A Coach or Coordinator goes with you on your first visit. They will usually meet you at the facility and bring everything you will need: UMCSCC Sunday Bulletin, Journey, CC Newsletter, a small gift which can be selected from the gift table at our meetings, church card to leave, and a green card to complete and turn in to the church after your visit. They will usually take you to visit at least two members: one who is mentally sharp and wants to converse about what's happening at the church, and one who has advanced dementia and cannot carry on a regular conversation.

After your first visit, you and the coach will meet for a short time in the lounge of the facility and discuss the visits you have made. If everything has progressed positively and you determine that Facility Visitation is what you want to do, you will be assigned two or three members to visit. When you have completed your first visits alone, the coach will discuss them with you and answer any questions you have.

If you know of anyone who can no longer come to church, please let me know so we can add them to our visitation list. Also, if you would like to be involved in this important ministry, please contact Doug and Elaine Moore at 634-4550, daeamoore@gmail.com.

Next month, we will discuss Home Bound Visitation in an interview with Doug and Elaine Moore, who founded this important ministry for Congregational Care at UMCSCC.

Mission of the Month for July, 2014 Steppin' Stone Farm Scholarship Program

As most of you have heard, Steppin' Stone Farm is closing at the end of this year. In the last three years, we have seen a dramatic increase in the lack of cooperation from a large percentage of the parents with whom we are working. This undermines what we can do with their daughter and undermines the program as a whole because of the effect it has on the families who are trying to comply. This, coupled with the lack of effective legal consequences for the girls who become violent or unruly, has made it impossible for our model to continue. Basically, we can't take in girls who don't want to be here and have parents who just want us to babysit without any support or change on their part.

We are moving along and working with the girls and families who are finishing their time with us. The board of directors met and voted to give the bulk of the assets to the Florida Baptist Children's Home. A cash gift will also be made to the Florida United Methodist Children's Home. Both of these organizations have been around a long time and have great reputations for ministry to children in need.

The Steppin' Stone Farm college scholarship fund will continue to function for several years and then any assets from that fund will be dispersed to the Florida Baptist and Methodist Children's Homes. All donations for the July Mission of the Month will go toward the Scholarship Program at Steppin' Stone Farm.

The good news is that children in Florida will continue to be helped for many years to come because of the investments you have made with us here at the Farm.

View from the Pew

I never cease to be amazed at the number of incredible people that are a part of our UMCSCC family. When I was looking for my next “victim” for this article, I couldn’t help but notice that there is a man who really stands out from the crowd when it comes to serving his church; someone who isn’t afraid to get his hands dirty, to be on call whenever he is needed to do whatever job needs to be done. I’m speaking of my friend, Earl Gall.



Earl grew up on a farm in Wisconsin. After graduating from High School, he joined the National Guard and served for a 6-year term. After basic training, Earl’s dad wanted him to come back and take over the farm, but Earl wanted something more. So his dad sold the farm and he and Earl went to work in a local canning factory. Earl advanced in the company until he was a team manager and oversaw the agricultural aspects of the business which included 6,000 acres of peas and 22,000 acres of sweet corn. That’s a lotta veggies!! But again, Earl just couldn’t decide what he wanted to do when he grew up so he tried his hand at running a gas station, an auto parts store and eventually owned a baseball/sports card shop. When he got a call from the veggie business asking him to come back to work for them again. They made him an offer he couldn’t refuse and he went back as a manager and worked there until his retirement 40 years later. Oh, and did I mention that in his spare time he was a fireman. He was awarded Firefighter of the Year twice and was also presented an award for 22 years of dedicated service by the Congressional Fire Services Institute. It’s easy to see that Earl is a man of tremendous drive, integrity and work ethic. This man is truly a hard worker!

As with so many of us who have ended up in lovely Sun City Center, Earl and his sweet wife, Gwynn, began vacationing in Florida to visit Gwynn’s parents in Treasure Island. About 7 years ago, they attended a Senior Fair at Tropicana Field and met some nice folks at lunch. Guess where those nice folks were from? You guessed it! They invited the Galls to come and check us out and within 2 or 3 days after their initial tour, they bought a lovely home in King’s Point. Gwynn stated, “We’re really blessed to live here!” Aren’t we all?

Earl is never at a loss for things to do around our church. He helps with the collection of items for Timely Treasures which, he mentions, has become a year-round job. He has been instrumental in starting the Dining to Donate program where local restaurants give back a percentage of their revenue to the church as well as initiating the “Have Project/Need Help” program. Earl’s first love though is being the team leader for the Disaster Rescue Team. In this capacity, he has headed up relief missions to Alabama twice, Tennessee twice, Georgia after Katrina, and numerous locations throughout Florida. In addition to those difficult rebuilding tasks, Earl and Gwynn have traveled to Watoto in Uganda and are planning to join the group going to Peru later this year.

When I asked Earl what stood out to him about our church family, he expressed it beautifully. “This is an active church. It’s all about the outreach. If someone needs help, I want to be there at the drop of a hat. We’re all brothers and sisters [in Christ] no matter what race or religion we happen to be. That doesn’t bother me one bit. I just want to help people.” And, Earl, you have blessed us all with your big heart for service!

All of the kids from Kidz Club, their parents, all of the staff and the entire congregation want to wish Linda Whitt the best! Linda is retiring from her staff position as Assistant Director of Ministries, where she has made such a difference in the lives of our kids. Her grants have fed children, paid for dental work and provided many opportunities for them. Her gift of singing and drama have made the children's performances ones which we will not forget. The good news is that Linda is NOT retiring from the church or from her volunteer work here at the church. She will continue as the coach of the Ministry Executive Team, continue playing keyboards with the Praise Team and many other things that she so willingly does for this church.
