

ABOUT THE NATIONAL COALITION OF 100 BLACK WOMEN, INC.

"The Coalition of 100 Black Women" was founded in New York in 1970 by a group of dedicated women. The Coalition of 100 Black Women was charted as a National non-profit organization in 1981 and renamed "The National Coalition of 100 Black Women" (NCBW). Today, NCBW consists of more than 7,000 members, representing 63 chapters in 24 states and the District of Columbia. The Oakland-Bay Area Chapter (OBAC) was charted in 1995.

WOMEN'S HEALTH

Areas of focus include the following health topics impacting our community: Heart Disease, Health and Nutrition, Diabetes, Breast Cancer and HIV/AIDS.



HIV/AIDS: In 2003, the Oakland Bay Area Chapter of NCBW launched the "Sistahs Getting Real About HIV/AIDS" program by sponsoring 15 billboards throughout the Bay Area, a HIV/AIDS Symposium and various workshops in an effort to educate women in our community. Oakland Bay Area Chapter efforts have resulted in over 500 individuals being tested for HIV/AIDS and has become a model for the National Organization.



MENTORING

NCBW/OBAC signature program, "Positive Steps" is a mentoring program developed to support and nurture leadership in young girls, ages 12 to 17. Our members are committed to investing in the education of future leaders and proving programs which will increase the participation of women and girls in the economic, civic, entrepreneurial and human service arenas.

The program provides young women the opportunity to recognize their full potential through the introduction of educational, developmental and cultural programs.

NCBW/OBAC focus is in health and wellness, careers, leadership, personal development and cultural awareness.

Participants receive graduation and matriculation awards and have an opportunity to receive a "Young Scholars Award" through the Scholarship Program. PSAT & SAT testing are provided and tutorial referral as needed. Each year our girls participate in the "Madam C.J. Walker Essay Contest" and the winner presents her essay at our annual fundraiser, the "Madam C. J. Walker Business and Community Recognition Awards Luncheon".

OUR INITIATIVES



SCHOLARSHIPS

NCBW/OBAC has awarded over \$360,000 dollars in scholarships and academic achievement awards to advance young scholars and mature women, who aspire to improve themselves through higher education.

Young Scholars - The "Young Scholars" are students in the Bay Area Schools who are bound for a four-year college, community college or trade school. Recipients of NCBW/OBAC's scholarships receive continued support as they complete their education at various universities and colleges. In 2012, the Andrea Jackson Scholarship was initiated increasing the number of scholarships NCBW/OBAC award each year.



WORKING WOMEN

The working women scholarships support women who delayed their educational goals and are returning to college as adults. NCBW/OBAC is committed to assisting low to moderate income families.

FINANCIAL EDUCATION

As an organization of women leaders in our communities, we have an obligation to assure that financial education is available to our sisters, brothers and young adults. We have a responsibility to self and our communities to be financially successful and upwardly mobile. To accomplish this goal, in 2011, NCBW/OBAC collaborated with our strategic corporate partner and presented - "My Sister's Keeper" - Your Money, Make It, Save It, Invest It & Enjoy It, a financial educational forum. The 4 hour program covered topics from Money Management, Real Estate in today's Market, Savings and Investment Strategies. The 2nd "My Sister's Keeper" - Your Money, Make It, Save It, Invest It and Enjoy It forum is scheduled for October 27, 2012, and will become an annual event.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Community Projects: NCBW/OBAC has contributed over \$197,000 dollars in community projects. NCBW/OBAC encourage active member involvement and participation in the civic process which can determine the progress and quality of life in the communities where we live and work.
