

#### FINANCIAL NEWS

After 7 months we should have received 58% of our giving, but in reality we have received 55%. This means we are currently about \$10,000 short of meeting our General Operating budget. The General Operating budget of \$327,000 funds salaries & benefits, operating expenses, missions/leadership teams, and apportionments.

March and June were 5 Sunday months which put us over the amount needed for those 2 months. The other 5 months of 2014 have fallen short of the monthly budget goal.



# **Electronic-Giving**

If you go to the First Church website (www.kentonfirst.org) and scroll down to the bottom, you will see a red ONLINE EASY GIVING button. If you click on the text, you will be directed to a screen that will allow first time users to register. You may be asked to provide the zip code of the church (43326). You will be asked to type in your name and address, envelope number (optional), phone number, and email address. You then create a 6-20 character username and an 8-20 character password (case sensitive). Once you have registered and received your confirmation email, you can then decide if you would like to have your (pledge) offering deducted from your checking or savings account. 
