◆ 1ST FRIDAY THIS WEEK

The Cartersville Downtown Development Authority will have their November First Friday event "Giving Thanks" tomorrow in downtown Cartersville from 5-8 p.m. Several nonprofit organizations will be set up to share information about their mission and needs. Many shops will be open until 8 p.m.

◆ BICYCLE RIDER CAUGHT WITH METH.

A 47 year old Cartersville man faces drug charges. Cartersville Police stopped Donnie Gene Bishop, who was riding a bicycle on Main Street. Officers found a glass smoking pipe with suspected methamphetamine residue in his pocket. Bishop was booked into the Bartow County Jail and charged with possession of methamphetamine and possession of drug related objects.

◆ BARGE WANTS A JOB

Georgia School Superintendent John Barge is a candidate for the job of Education Commissioner in Kansas. According to United School Administrators of Kansas, Barge and three other candidates for the position interviewed for the job this week. Barge ran in the Georgia primary election as a gubernatorial candidate against the incumbent governor and lost. Before becoming Ga. School Superintendent he served as the Director of Secondary Curriculum and Instruction with the Bartow County School System. He most recently applied for the top education post in Utah which went to another candidate. Barge is a Floyd County native.

◆ The Ga. Department of Economic Development will host a tour of Kingston historic sites November 8th from 9:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m. as part of General Sherman's March to the Sea. The tour will start at 9:30 a.m. at Queen Chapel Methodist Church, 105 Johnson St. Stops will include Kingston City Cemetery, Kingston Stationmasters house and Sherman's headquarters, Kingston Depot, Wayside Home, Kingston Methodist Church and Kingston Confederate Museum and Woman's History Museum. Also this weekend is the Old Cassville Cemetery Luminaries commemorating the 150th anniversary of the Burning of Cassville in November 1864.

◆ Taylor Swift's new album has sold 1.287 million copies in its first week. "1989" earned the largest sales in a week for an album since Eminem's "The Eminem Show" sold 1.322 million units in 2002. Swift is the only artist to have three albums push more than 1 million units in its debut week.

◆ U.S. Customs and Border Protection officials said about 200 counterfeit handbags were seized at the Port of Savannah. The fake Hermes were being shipped to an Atlanta address. In July, 377 cartons of knock off sunglasses were seized with an estimated manufacturers suggested retail price of \$1.8 million.
