How Bidding Works

The Annual Auction is UUCA's major annual fundraiser. Every year, each family is assigned a new bidder number that we use to track transactions, so make sure you get yours for this year.

In the catalog, and in the supplement that is published right before the auction, you'll find two categories of items to bid on: Silent and Oral.

NOTE THAT THIS YEAR, SILENT AUCTION ITEMS WILL BE PULLED AT 6:30, 6:45, 7:00, AND 7:15. THE LIVE AUCTION WILL BE HELD DURING DINNER, STARTING AT 7:30.

Cards for **Silent** items will be posted on the kiosks in the Fellowship Hall on October 19th. The cards are grouped according to item type: the 200 series for example, is for dinner parties. On the night of the auction, silent item cards will be located on tables in the Fellowship Hall, grouped by pull time.

Please note that this year, items in the Treasures Room will be sold first come/first served by cash or check; there will be no bidding (similar to how the Jewelry Room is run).

Bidding on silent items is closed at the time indicated on the card. Cards are collected and winning bids are determined by the bid analysts. Data is verified and entered into the auction database. The silent bids that generate the most revenue for the church are the winners, with one exception. In the case of dinners, which are often bid on by couples, a bid for one person can win over the bid for two people if the single bid is for a higher per person amount. For example, a single bid for \$35 will win over a bid for two people at \$20 each.

Bidding for **Oral** items is conducted in the classic way. Our auctioneer tracks the bidding aloud while participants raise their bids until no higher bids are made. Winner information is collected and entered into the auction database.

Many people work hard to have invoice information ready for winners on Auction night. You can help in these ways:

- Be patient (we are not e-Bay)
- Bring your catalog, bidder number, and checkbook on Auction night
- Volunteer! In previous years, over 100 members and friends donated their time in planning and conducting the Services Auction. We need your help to create success.

Bidding Tips

1. On silent bids, use pencil so you can erase your earlier bid and replace it with a higher one if you want to outbid someone else. When winning bids are calculated, if there is a tie between two bidders, the bid on the higher line wins.
2. On silent bids, write your bidder number, name and bid amount LEGIBLY. Use your correct bidder number. This helps us process your bids faster.
3. Bid early – register your first bid on a bidding card before the auction even starts. (See tip 1 for rationale.)
4. Dinner parties and group events such as tours are a great way to get to know other members.
5. If you cannot attend the auction, you can silent bid before the auction starts, and then designate a church member or friend to raise your bid on your behalf, if necessary, on Auction night.

REGISTRATION

Registration will take place at the Auction table in Fellowship Hall after each Sunday service on **October 19 and 26**; online at <http://ucaauction2014.eventbrite.com> . Tickets for general admission ONLY will be available on Auction night, Saturday, November 1nd, as described below.

Catalog & Bidder Number Pick-Up: Go to the AUCTION TABLE in the Fellowship Hall to receive a catalog and your bidder number (one per family, unless you want separate invoices to pay separately). This bidder number will identify you when you place a bid in case we can't read your name (it happens! – your bidder number will help ensure we know who the winner is!). **If you are an old hand, please note that the numbers change each year and you need to stop and get a new number!** If you are not using the NEW correct bidder number, it could duplicate someone else's or we may not be able to match the number up with you. It will cause endless hours to reconcile bidder numbers. There is no cost/charge for a bidder number.

Auction Tickets: Tickets for the Auction and dinner are \$45. No dinner tickets will be available auction night. A \$10 ticket is required to attend the Auction. This ticket fee offsets the cost of the auction (auction software, supplies, catalog printing, decorations, hors d'oeuvres, etc.). Go to the AUCTION TABLE in the Fellowship Hall on Sundays to purchase your tickets (cash or check only). Tickets will also be on sale on Auction night.

PRE-AUCTION BIDDING

Starting on **Sunday, October 19th**, we will begin **SILENT BIDDING**. All bidding requires a BIDDER NUMBER. For all items listed in this catalog and the supplement, there will be corresponding cards posted on the display kiosks in Fellowship Hall. Items will be grouped by category in the same sequence as those in this catalog.

AUCTION NIGHT ACTIVITIES

SILENT BIDDING closes for item cards at **6:30pm, 6:45pm, 7:00 pm** or **7:15pm**, as stated by the time printed on each card. The cards will also be color-coded to identify the time at which they will be closed. At the appointed time, runners will pick up the appropriately colored cards, so keep an eye on your written bids to update them before the items close. There will also be cards color-coded for Oral Bid items, you can silent bid on these items until their respective Oral Auction time; if no one makes an oral bid for an item, the silent bid will win. See bidding tips on the previous page.

ORAL BIDDING – This year oral auction will be during the dinner..

QUILT RAFFLE – The Quilt Raffle drawing will occur at **8:00pm**.. This is a new, 36" x 44" baby quilt, made by a talented quilter with their own long arm machine. Quilt tickets are \$2 each, or 3/\$5. Tickets are available, and quilt is on display, after Sunday Services in Fellowship Hall and on Auction night.

GIFT CERTIFICATE RAFFLES – NEW THIS YEAR - Many gift certificates for items such as restaurants or services will be won by raffles. Gift certificate raffle tickets are \$2 each, 3 for \$5. Place as many tickets into the (BOX? ENVELOPE?) for a particular certificate as you wish – the more you play, the better your chances! Winners will be drawn during the live auction!

FIFTY-FIFTY RAFFLE – The Fifty-Fifty Raffle drawing will occur around **8:15pm**, right after the Wine Raffle and before the final round of Oral Bidding. 50/50 tickets are \$1 each, or 7/\$5. Tickets are available after Sunday Services in Fellowship Hall and on Auction night.

TREASURES ROOM – Items on display in the Treasures Room (in the Board Room & Lounge) are individually priced and will be **sold first-come, first-served (no bidding)**. These items can only be purchased by **cash or check (no credit cards)**, and they **must be paid for inside the Treasures Room** (not by auction cashiers sitting in the lobby). If you purchase an item in the Treasures Room, **you must take it home on Auction night**.

TINY JEWELRY BOX – Jewelry pieces on display in the Tiny Jewelry Box (in the church library) are individually priced and will be sold first-come, first-served (no bidding). This jewelry can only be purchased by cash or check (no credit cards), and they must be paid for inside the Tiny Jewelry Box (not by auction cashiers sitting in the lobby).

FOOD – A plated dinner will be served during the live auction. Hors d'oeuvres, water, coffee, and hot tea will be available throughout the evening, at no additional cost.

DRINKS – Bartenders will be serving soda, beer, and wine in exchange for **drink tickets**. Beer & wine require three (3) \$1 drink tickets; soda requires one (1) \$1 drink ticket. Purchase your drink tickets at the drink ticket table before approaching the bartenders. Water, coffee and hot tea will be available at no additional cost.

CHILDCARE – Childcare services will be provided by UUCA from 6:00 -9:15pm on Auction night at no cost. However, **you must provide advance notice** to use these services. **By Monday, October 27th, Noon**, please contact the RE administrative staff at reasst@uucava.org or 703-892-2565 with your name and contact information, as well as your children's names and ages.

IMPORTANT NOTES: READ THIS MESSAGE AND BRING THIS CATALOG WITH YOU!

If you have any questions about the items offered in this catalog, call the donor before Auction night to clear up any uncertainties. You win what is described in the catalog – please do not ask the donor to make or provide something other than what is described.

Before you buy an item, be sure to check that the date will work for you. Everyone is donating his/her time to do the service; it is not fair to ask them to do it more than the times agreed upon. **PLEASE REMEMBER, UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED, ALL WINNING ITEMS MUST BE CLAIMED BY OCTOBER 31, 2015.**

If you wish to bid but cannot attend Auction night, have a friend who is already attending enter proxy bids for you. Your friend must use your name and your bidding number, and not their own. If you do not have a bidder number, your friend can register your name and get you a bidder number.

PRINT YOUR BIDDER NUMBER IN LARGE TYPE ON THE BACK OF YOUR CATALOG. All bids must be in FULL DOLLARS. Unless otherwise stated, all items are offered once, at a time shown or as mutually convenient to the donor and bidder.

Please pay for the items that you purchase promptly; THIS IS REVENUE FOR THE CHURCH. We want to wrap up the auction within one month of the event. Beginning at 7:15pm, cashiers will be available in the church lobby to take payment for cash or check. If you have won an item available Auction night, you must pay before taking it with you.

UUCA PREFERS PAYMENT BY CHECK. Cash is also acceptable, and we ask that you only use your credit card if you have no other option because at least 5% of your payment will go to credit card and online processing fees, and not to UUCA. **If paying by credit card, please seriously consider adding 5% to your invoice amount to offset these fees,** or at least select the option on the church's credit card payment web page to automatically increase your payment by 2.75% to moderately offset these fees.

If you are **paying by credit card**, the cashiers will provide you with 2 copies of your invoice, and then you must go to the church office and use a computer to make a credit card payment on the church website. You should then print 2 copies of the web page showing payment, and then give your 2 invoices and these 2 proof of payment pages to the auction volunteer in the office. They will pair them up, stamp them as paid, keep one pair for the church, and provide the other pair back to you.

Cashiers will also be in the Fellowship Hall on Sunday, November 2nd, and Sunday, November 9th, after each service to accept payments and wrap things up. Items not sold at the auction will remain posted on the kiosks and available for bid/purchase until 1:00pm November 9th.

It is the **winner's responsibility to contact the donor** and arrange for delivery. Items must be collected within 12 months, or as specified in the item description. Please collect the items you have won, people are disappointed if their donated items are not claimed. Donors and winners will meet new friends and share the knowledge that they have contributed to the SUCCESS of the Annual Auction!

NEW – GIFT CERTIFICATE RAFFLES

This year, if you want one or more of the ever-popular gift certificates for various items (restaurants, Home Depot, even Arena Stage) you will need to enter the raffle for that item. Raffle tickets are \$3 each, 2 for \$5, 5 for \$10. Simply write your bidder number on the back and place in the gift bag for the certificate you want. The more tickets you place into one bag, the better your chance of winning! (Of course, the more tickets you place in more bags increases your odds even more!)

Keep the stub so we can verify the winner; sometimes numbers are hard to read. We'll draw the winners during the live auction, so stick around!
