Pastor Bill's Message

Dear Family and Friends,

*Praise the Lord, my soul;
all my inmost being, praise his holy name.
Praise the Lord, my soul,
and forget not all his benefits—
who forgives all your sins
and heals all your diseases,
who redeems your life from the pit
and crowns you with love and compassion,
who satisfies your desires with good things
so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.*



So begins Psalm 103, one of my favorite psalms of thanksgiving. Notice that the psalmist thanks God for forgiveness, healing, redemption, compassion and provision....but wait! That means that in order for God to BLESS the writer of the psalm, he (or she) first was in a state of distress! Forgiveness is necessary only where there are *shortcomings*; healing is necessary only where there is *disease*; redemption is necessary only where there is *peril*; compassion is necessary only where there is *suffering*; and, provision is necessary only where there is *need*.

And so it goes, my friends. Troubles are part of life—they will come whether we plan for them or not, whether we ask for them or not, whether we do our best to avoid them or not. It's unavoidable to encounter "trials of many kinds" (James 1:2).

The good news is this: God is present with us no matter what we are going through. And not just present, but filled with compassion and ready to strengthen and accompany us in our troubles. And there is more good news: we are part of Christ's Body, the church! As we sing with the children each Sunday morning, "No one stands alone." In the face of our troubles, we are not alone.

As we turn our calendars to the month on November and the air grows chillier and the nights grow longer, let us remember that this is a season of thanks-giving. It is a time to be grateful for our blessings. It is a time to thank God for all of the ways that we are guided through our trials—with God's love and God's church bringing comfort and help when we are in need.




Congregational Meeting

Honoring William Reith: November 10th



This Event was rescheduled to November 10th to accommodate a change in the speaker's availability.

In 1911, thirteen stained glass windows were installed in the Church's sanctuary, vestibule and parlor (which, at the time, was the Sunday School room). Their beauty continues to inspire us to this day. The creator of these masterpieces was William Reith, a Philadelphia artisan.

On Sunday, November 10th during our worship service, we will have the honor of a guest speaker who will deliver a special message about our

windows and their creator. Ms. Laura A. Young, the great granddaughter of William Reith, will share with us stories of her grandfather and his ministry—and insights into our beautiful windows.


The Mitten Tree is Back!

As the 275th Anniversary approaches in 2015, the History Corner will begin giving information about the Pastors who have served at Boehm's since it was established in 1740.

1778-1787 : The Synod was not pleased that Boehm's and Wentz's had called Rev. John Weikel and they refused to consider supplying a new one until a formal apology had been submitted to the Synod. The charge stood vacant until 1784 except for occasional supply pastors. In 1784 after repentance and apology for past sins, the Synod permitted John Herman Winkhaus to become pastor for Boehm's, Wentz's and Trappe's congregations.

Winkhaus had recently arrived in America when he received this call and immediately began his duties as Pastor. "The people received him kindly, and he served them with faithfulness and success until April 19, 1787, when he resigned to minister to the congregation of the Race Street Church in Philadelphia. Mr. Winkhaus was" pleasant in his manners, quick in his movements and in his speech, cheerful and sprightly in social circles and a man of considerable learning." Rev. Winkhaus was a very courageous minister. He stayed with his congregation in Philadelphia during the Yellow Fever epidemic of 1793 which ravaged the members. He was one of the last to contract the disease and die.

Marie Hagner is setting up two concerts. On September 29th it will be for Manna on Main Street. On November 24th it will be for Inter-Faith. It was approved that money raised at both concerts will be matched under the guidelines of the Isabelle Smullen Fund.

Anita will arrange a time that will work for Marie, Pastor and Danielle from Inter-Faith for the check to be presented during a Sunday morning worship service.

Pastor reported that he has been in contact with the Maasai Cultural Exchange Project representative who indicated a willingness to make a presentation at Boehm's Church. It was approved that \$1,000.00 be given from the Isabelle Smullen Fund for this ministry to be given entirely this year or paid over 2 years depending on their availability to come to Boehm's this year. Pastor will follow up with them.

1.) Welcome

- Thanked Anita Law for her leadership and continued support of the History Committee.

2.) Financial Report

3.) Old Business

- 275th Anniversary: Discussed Rev. Bob's suggestions for special services commemorating the history of Boehm's. Pastor Bill would like to have a special service once a month starting in Jan., 2014 highlighting the church's history. The children will also participate in the service. Also, a cemetery tour and serving food indicative of that time period were suggested events.
- Judy K. shared a newspaper article from the Reporter about General Hancock.

4.) New Business

- Bob Whittock submitted information about the Montgomery County 2014 History Fair. The theme will be Montco in the Civil War. Judy and Lorraine will consult with Anita about any pertinent documents might be in the museum.
- Memorial Day Service was discussed. Pastor Bill recommended inviting other churches to participate and ,hopefully, compliment any other local activities planned. Contact should be made between Jan. and May, 2014.
