Block of the Month

"Asian Beauty" Block

You will need four (4) different Asian fabrics for this block. I just used four for each of the blocks pictured below. Use your creativity and see what you can come up with. Experiment! It's fun!

- From Fabric A, cut eight (8) $2\frac{1}{2}$ by $3\frac{1}{2}$ strips.
- From Fabric B, cut eight (8) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " by $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- From Fabric C, cut four (4) $1\frac{1}{2}$ by $5\frac{1}{2}$ strips.
- From Fabric D, cut two (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " by 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and two (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " by 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. These will be the outer border
- 1. From Fabrics A and B, sew these two pieces together. You will have eight (8) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " by $5\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- 2. Sew Fabric C to the middle of each of these pieces so the squares will be in opposite corners. You will now have four (4) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " by $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- 3. Position these squares so that the small squares meet in the center of the new block. Sew these four blocks together to make a 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " by 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square.
- 4. Sew the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " by 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D to the outer edges. Then sew the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " by 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips along the other outer edge. You will now have a 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " by 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

I've used different fabrics for these squares, and each one is different and somewhat surprising. Use as many different Asian-inspired fabrics as you can. The outcomes will be delightful. I can't wait to see what you come up with.







CCQ 2014 Challenge

Stir up your creative juices to get ready for the next Challenge. Your entries will be due at the February 13 meeting. The theme for this year will be "NOT YOUR GRANDMOTHER'S NINEPATCH".

- 1. The challenge is to make 9 parts of any shape or size (square, rectangle, circles, trapezoids, triangles, etc) and attach them to each other, not in a traditional way, but connected in an altogether new way formulated by each of you. (Think buttons, ribbons, zippers, wire mesh)
- 2. The quilt (completely finished) must be wholly constructed by the person who enters it and must have a hanging sleeve so that it may be shown.
- 3. Write a story about the inspiration for your quilt. You will be asked for this and the title of your entry by the end of January.
- 4. Quilts must have been started after June 2013.
- 5. Limit quilts to 180" in perimeter. If you happened to start a quilt after the June meeting and it is larger, please contact me.

There will be 3 awards: first, second, and third, accompanied by ribbons and cash. I will be happy to answer any questions. Please call me at 503-761-8596 or email me at the email address listed above.

We have been working all summer on making backs for over 100 quilt tops. If everyone who has a long arm will take at least one quilt home each month, we could have them all done and given out by Christmas. Most of them are twin size and would only take about 2 hours to quilt.

We have 5 boxes of kits for quilt tops with patterns. We would like you to return the patterns this year, so we can make up new kits with the same pattern. Copy rights prevent us from copying them.

We have lots of quilts that need binding and labels put on. Please come to the Charity table and pick up something to work on at home.

Our work days will be on Thursdays this year. Dates scheduled so far are September19 and 26, October 3, 17, 24, and 31, November 14 and 21 December 5 and 19.

October's charms and strips will be beautiful Asian themed fabrics. Think of elegant butterflies and flowers, soaring cranes and bamboo, koi in tranquil ponds and everything trimmed with a little gold! This is an awesome month to participate if you are planning on attending the Fall CCQ Retreat: the theme is Asian Elegance! You will be ready to sew with your exchange fabrics.

This will be the theme for both the charms and the strips.

To participate, purchase or use about one yard of *quality* fabric from your stash, in the theme of the month and cut:

- For Strips -cut (12) $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch strips the width of the fabric.
- For Charms— Cut into (24) matching pairs of 5" squares. You can have different fabrics, or all 48 squares can be the same. Cut accurately, and no selvages and selvage holes, please.
- Place your strips in a zip-lock bag with your name and phone number on it. Come to the Guild meeting and drop it off at our table!

We will have finished samples for you to check out at the table and we will enclose the pattern links for the samples in the bags we return to you the next month! You will save money and get a nice selection of themed fabrics for quilts, table runners, bags and more!

We will have samples and descriptions of the classes being offered. Again this year the fee for a class is \$10.00 for a 1/2day or \$20.00 for a full day class.






