# Homecoming Week 2013 

**All dress days and participation in events is entirely optional**

## All week:

- Hats are permitted all week, but cannot cover the face or be a distraction to learning. Staff reserve the right to request students take off their hats if they are disruptive or that is necessary for the class activity.
- Pencil Prize Game - for $\$ 0.25$, students may play the PenciL Prize Game for the chance to win prizes. Everybody walks away with a pencil though!


## Monday, October $14^{\text {th }}$ - No School - Columbus Day <br> Tuesday, October 15 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ - "Pajama Day" Theme Dress

- Students may wear their Pajamas to school today as long as it is school appropriate. This means that it cannot be revealing, clingy, or too little clothing. If students do not wear "school appropriate" pajamas, they may be asked to go home and change. Students are more than welcome to wear pajamas over traditional day clothes.
- Today, there will be designated "Dance Zones" where Student Government members take video of students who wish to participate in the Dance Contest between classes. If they dance in the designated Dance Zone, then they will be choosing to participate.
- Students will vote on the following categories:

- Is that Dancing? Dancer
- Students will be asked to stop dancing if it is inappropriate, vulgar, offensive or in poor sportsmanship to other dancers.


## Wednesday, October 16 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ - "Costume Day" Theme Dress

- Students who wear costumes to school may be photographed to enter into the Costume Contest.
- Students who do not wish to be in the Costume Contest will not be entered.
- Costumes must be school appropriate, cannot cover the face, and must be tasteful. Students who do not abide by these regulations may be asked to go home and change. As long as it doesn't violate any of the dress code rules about appropriateness, then it should be fine. Example: no skintight pants, too short shorts, too low cut shirts, etc.
- Students will vote on the following costume categories:

- Worst Villian
- Most Unique

Thursday, October 17 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ - "Classy Day" Theme Dress

- Classy Day means "dress up": gloves, bowties, tiaras, suits, fancy gowns, etc.
- Again, it must be school appropriate, no face coverings, and may not disrupt learning in any way.
- Starting Tuesday, October $15^{\text {th }}$, students may bring in decorations to decorate for their Advisory's Doorway/Door for the "Door Decorating Contest." Today, the doors will be photographed after school and voted on tomorrow (Friday) during lunch for the following categories:
- Where's the STEM Award? - Which door best advocates the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics?
- I've Never Seen Anything Like it! Award - Which door is the most creative, original, and shows the best craftsmanship?
- We're Proud to be Here! Award - The most school spirited door that encompasses all that we are at STEM .


## Friday, October $18^{\text {th }}$ - "Twin Day" Theme Dress

- Today, students can dress like a classmate (again, must be school appropriate).
