### **Macomb County**

MATTS (Salvation Army)	586-755-5191	Serves Macomb County residents first—must have ID. Operated by the Salvation Army, located at 24140 Mound Road (between Nine Mile and Ten Mile Road, on the east side of Mound) in Warren, MATTS (Macomb's Answer to Temporary Shelter) provides 30 days shelter (per year) for up to 50 persons. Residents must be out during the day looking for work and attending appointments. An alcohol test is required nightly. Counselors assist residents plan for permanent housing.
MCREST (rotating churches)	586-415-5101 <a href="http://mcrest.org">mcrest.org</a>	Intakes are taken Monday to Sunday, 1 to 4 PM at 20415 Erin, Roseville, (behind Sam's Club at Gratiot & 13). Must pass breathalyzer nightly and random drug tests after 5 days. The Macomb County Rotating Emergency Shelter Team (MCREST) is a group of participating congregations that open up their facilities to the homeless, one week per year at each location, so that the entire year is covered. Some weeks shelter is provided at two churches so that capacity of about 60 persons is maintained. Volunteers and staff provide transportation, meals, and assist the homeless to plan for and seek permanent solutions to their situation. Shelter stay is limited to 30 days (per year), or up to 90 days for 10 individuals or families in the CAP, "Choose A Path" program. These persons receive intensive case management, counseling, and advocacy services.
TURNING POINT (domestic violence)	586-463-4430 (business line) 586-463-6990 (crisis line) <a href="http://turningpointinc.com">turningpointinc.com</a>	Domestic Violence Shelter—provides 24 hour crisis line, 24 hour emergency shelter (up to 30 days maximum stay for women & children), domestic and sexual violence counseling, hospital and court advocacy, case management services, children's program, community education/prevention, Second Hand Rose Resale Shop, support groups, Families First Program, Forensic Nurse Examiner Program, & Personal Protection Order Assistance. Macomb county residents are served first—ID is required.
MACOMB WARMING CENTER (wintertime only)	586-321-0998 <a href="http://www.warmingcenter.org">www.warmingcenter.org</a>	The Warming Center is in operation rotating weekly at several churches from November to March. Provided are two blankets, a pillow, and space on the floor, along with a soup supper and breakfast. The hours are usually 8:00 PM to 7:00 AM. The only condition for admission is good behavior. Volunteers are welcome, however they

FAMILY YOUTH INTERVENTIONS (adolescents)	586-465-1212 <a href="http://www.familyyouth.com">www.familyyouth.com</a>	Adolescent Shelter and Counseling Center—Services include 14 day safe shelter for youth 10-17 with family and individual therapy & daily group counseling leading to the return home of the youth upon discharge, or a positive alternative. Other services are 90 day outpatient counseling, 24 hour crisis line, information and referral, community presentations, and the Homeless Youth Program, apartments for youth who are 18-20 & homeless (can be staying with friends) They must be employed, rent=30%.
EMERGENCY SHELTER HOTLINE (any caller)	800-274-3583 (1-800-a-shelter)	A statewide emergency hotline--will help locate the nearest shelter to the caller and make a placement. If the person calling is in Detroit, the person can be picked up and taken to a shelter

MACOMB HOMELESS COALITION (a waiting list is open for Housing Vouchers for the homeless)	586-285-0400 <a href="http://www.macombhomelesscoalition.com">www.macombhomelesscoalition.com</a>	<p>The Macomb Homeless Coalition is supported, in part, by the Macomb County Community Services Agency, the Macomb County Board of Commissioners and the Macomb/St. Clair Workforce Development Board. It is a non-profit organization dedicated to coordinating, assisting, and enhancing the efforts of Macomb County organizations and groups who shelter and assist the homeless. It is the official body charged with reporting and administering the Continuum of Care for Macomb.</p> <p>Applications are being accepted for section 8 vouchers by individuals or families who have been homeless for at least 7 days. The application must be made within 90 days of the homeless period, and the individual/ family must have left the shelter in good standing. Also individuals/families can apply if they were homeless 28 days but not in a shelter, but are in continuous contact</p>

		with a helping agency. Section 8 vouchers pay a subsidy to the landlord for the part of the rent that exceeds 30% of household income. This program is also called the <u>Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program</u> . In addition, you will need to provide Social Security cards and birth certificates for all members of the household, picture ID for adults, and a verification form completed by a shelter or helping agency.
