
Rivers of Living Water

Loyola on the Potomac is a Retreat House founded by the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in 1958 to serve the greater Baltimore/Washington DC area. It is built on a bluff overlooking the Potomac River, surrounded by 235 acres of rolling woodland. The house is air-conditioned, with two Chapels, comfortable lounges, and sitting rooms, with 70 individual bedrooms (each with a half bath).

Retreats are conducted in an atmosphere of prayerful silence throughout the house, including generous amounts of time for prayer, personal reflection and the cultivation of a deep relationship with God. There is daily Eucharist and the possibility of celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
