Sophia entered the U.S. as a Montagnard refugee from the Central Highlands of Vietnam. Now 22 years old and studying in her second year of community college, Sophia recently served as a translator with a Montagnard group which travelled from First Christian Church of Charlotte, N.C. to Washington, D.C. to make legislative visits and fight for human rights for her community still in Vietnam. After that "practice" in civic engagement, Sophia returned to her home in Charlotte, N.C. for her citizenship ceremony—just two days after her time in D.C.!
