Taylor, MI – Tonight, August 13<sup>th</sup> will showcase trumpeting sensation, Dave Tatrow along with featured artist Emily Daugherty of Dearborn Heights, MI. Dave Tatrow has played annually at the Taylor Conservatory and has always received an outpouring of love and enthusiasm from his downriver fans! Tatrow's father and two uncles were both banjo players in the area around Otisville where Dave was born. He started strumming at the age of seven and joined his father's band at eight.

Later on he took up the trumpet, flugelhorn, and vibes, playing with a number of traditional and swing bands in the Flint-Detroit areas. His formal education took place at Flint's Mott Community College. By day, he is the long-time city manager of Otisville, MI. He joined the highly acclaimed, New Reformation Jazz Band in 1979 and has toured with them across the state and nationally ever since. For tonight's show, Tatrow's band will include an all-star cast: the infamous, Jerry MacKenzie on drums, Ray Tini on bass, Pat Cronley on keys, and himself as the front man, leading the show!

Emily Daugherty, 22, will present her eclectic blend of visual art through the mediums of graphite pencil, watercolor, photoshop, and in some cases, gold leaf. "I love fashion and lifestyle and I try to incorporate those aesthetics in everything I create, from the outfits and/or makeup my models wear, to the actual application of medium to paper. I also love to hone in on what makes that person unique, usually focusing in on their eyes or some other facial feature that shows that person's God given beauty," says Daugherty, commenting on the influence behind her exhibit.

Emily will be graduating in December with a Bachelor's of Fine Arts degree, that includes a focus of Illustration, from the College for Creative Studies in Detroit, Michigan. In her time there, she has received many acknowledgements for her illustrative abilities including the honor of personally creating the poster for the 2014 North American International Auto Show at Cobo Hall in Detroit. Daugherty will be on site to present her exhibit which will include her award winning auto show design and many other unique works of art. You won't want to miss the chance to meet this multi-talented up and coming new artist, she is certainly going places!
