In North America, California is at the forefront of seeking to invent a model for a new railroad system that can meet 21st century mobility needs.

This lecture will analyze the likelihood that an interconnected passenger rail infrastructure in California will pay increasing dividends over time due to demographic, energy and climate change trends that could each boost the demand for moving people and freight by rail.

Anthony Perl is Director of the Urban Studies Program at Simon Fraser University in Vancouver, British Columbia. He has authored or co-authored four books, most recently Transport Revolutions: Moving People and Freight Without Oil (2008). Anthony's research crosses disciplinary and national boundaries to explore the policy decisions that affect transportation, cities and the environment.
