They also persuaded the manufacturer of hot chili sauce to set their sights on very high-quality product.

The carefully created range of gourmet products included Salsas's salsa, which has been cooked with care and made from fresh imported tomatoes.

But their aim is to stay true to the end of the month when the time calls to focus on making their products and Salsas.

Until then, they are offering 50 to 60 per cent discounts on all their products.

The reason is that they have just brought in a shipment of new products. These include the firm's range of salsa (S' all for a 50% per cent from the US).

I have found a replacement: Edmond & Sons Pacific Rice Toast, which is made in Thailand.

The square crackers are just big enough to eat in one bite and can be topped with any amount of things.

The Thai Red Bean & Pomegranate variety tastes very healthy and a little more appetising than my usual wheat-flour ones. It is, however, a little bland.



A better option is Purple Rice & Black Sesame, which is made from black sesame seeds. It tastes really yummy and one will certainly make it a worthy replacement for chips.

The reason may have been potato wedges into the potato dough. Olive Pop & Butter is flavoured with tender or salted real one. It is good that the butter flavour comes through more strongly than the rest, which is a pity.

However, the Potato & Butter variety is combined with lots of soft potato flavour and a pretty robust melting butter flavour.

been for instant noodles. There is no shortage of condiments in my fridge but I decide to give this a go.

Whoa. Who knew chilli marmalade would work so well with noodles? Topped with some chopped coriander leaves, the noodles make a very good supper.
