Mosaics

This fun, hands-on workshop will teach how to plan, design, prepare the tesserae, create and grout a mosaic tile plaque. Different types of glazed tiles will be used while we discuss so many other types of material suitable for mosaic use. Safety and tool use will be explored as well as the history and uses of mosaics from past to present. For ages 10-18, this class is limited to 6 students.

Fused Glass Blok Lights

Students will be introduced to fused glass terms and learn fused glass techniques by creating a beautiful 'Blok Light'. These are the same techniques used to make fused glass jewelry and bowls. We will explore the medium with topics including class compatibility, thermal shock, proper use of cutting, and grinding tools, preparing pieces for the kiln and firing. Students will produce 2 glass panels which will be adhered to the hollow glass blocks, and prepare them with lights. This is a beautiful and functional product which you will be proud to display and talk about for a lifetime. Closed toe shoes are required. For ages 14-18, this class is limited to 8 students.

Introduction to Blacksmithing

In a two hour class students will be introduced to the art and science of Blacksmithing. After a brief introduction to safe work habits and an outline of the craft, students will get hands on with hammer and anvil as they make a "J-Hook". This beginner project gives good experience with a variety of basic skills and will allow each student to complete a useful and beautiful object. Each step will be demonstrated as we go, allowing students to "see and do" in age appropriate bite sized chunks. This two hour class is so popular, we are offering it twice! For ages 9-12, space is limited to 4 children for each class. This class requires an adult register and attend with a child. Sturdy, closed toe shoes and cotton clothing is required.

Copper Repoussé

What do the Statue of Liberty and Paul Revere have in common? Repoussé!

Repoussé is a metalworking process in which a malleable metal is shaped by hammering from the reverse side to create a design in low relief. Chasing is the opposite technique to repoussé, and the two are used in conjunction to create a finished piece. This workshop will teach the techniques and applications of repoussé. Each student will be using copper to create a finished piece of art using their new knowledge. For ages 10-14, this class is limited to 8 students.

The Art of Weaving Can you (Be)Weave This??

This active workshop brings the ancient art of weaving to life as we explore the history of fabrics, the art of design through weaving, and the possibilities for their own creations. Discover weaving throughout world cultures, see how weaving opens up your artistic, creative side - you will work with color, design and imagination. Each student will use a small hand loom to weave their own tapestry, which can be used as a wall hanging, small carry bag, or doll house rug. They can take home their unique creations as well as the small loom so that they can continue to weave. For ages 8-12, this class is limited to 10 students.

Textured Bracelet

Students will etch and 'roll print' patterns into metal to make a cuff bracelet. You will learn basic jewelry and metal forming skills including use of a rolling mill, hammers, mandrels, patina and finishing techniques. These are real metal smithing skills to get you started and intrigued with jewelry making. For ages 8-12, this class is limited to 8 students.

Father/Son Resin Casting Workshop - Create your own game pieces

Great father/son activity or student can attend with any adult. Each set of partners will use 2 part resin to make a custom checkers set. You will learn about different types of resin, as well as other uses for the medium. Several additive options will be available in the class so you can custom create a unique look and color to your game piece set. For ages 8-14, this class is limited to 6 students. Wire Work and Soldering

Create a beautiful 2-3' hanging wall art out of copper wire. You begin with a drawing of your intended object, translate it into copper wire, soldering all the joints together. Solder and soldering irons techniques will be taught as well as safety techniques. This piece of copper art will take a place of honor in your home! For ages 8-18, this class is limited to 6 students.

Mother/Daughter Resin Bracelet

Great mother/daughter activity or student can attend with any other adult. Students and adults will use 2 part resin to each make stunning bracelets. You will learn about different types of resin, and some basic jewelry making skills including making jump rings, custom links, clasps. We will discuss the various tools used and you will also take home your own customized link jig. For ages 8-12, this class is limited to 6 students.

Lathe Turning Basics

You will be introduced to the craft of lathe turning through demonstration and hands-on practice. Each student will learn how to make an acrylic pen by using a pen kit and acrylic blanks. Our tabletop lathe and a variety of tools will be used to tooling, shaping, sanding, and polishing the acrylic blanks. Then we will use jigs & fixtures to assemble the various pen parts to the acrylic pieces, creating a custom pen. Students will learn lathe safety, how to set up the lathe, basic spindle turning, sanding, polishing, and discover the many styles of custom pens that can be designed. For ages 11-14, this class is limited to 6 students.

Lamp Glass Beads

In this workshop students will have a chance to discover the exciting magic of melting colorful glass rods into beads.
