The second series of Breaking the Chains of the Past program workshops will begin in early June and continue throughout the summer months and September on Wednesday evenings from 6-8:30pm.

Be a mentor. Training is provided. Weekly dinner and gatherings on Wednesday evenings for 15 weeks with workshops on life skills and relationship building.

Volunteer teams are needed to provide and serve the weekly dinner meal for 20-25 persons, and to sit and eat together. Volunteer social workers would be most welcome to help with referrals and case management when needed.
