## Each workshop will cover:

#### Risk management

Municipalities may be concerned about liability (though the IDNR has never been sued by a volunteer). Attorneys from the municipal law firm of Ancel, Glink, Diamond, Bush, DiCianni & Kraftheter, PC, will discuss how and why to use waivers and what liability issues to consider.

### Openlands TreeKeepers

These are trained urban forestry volunteers ready to work in your community. Learn how TreeKeepers are organized and trained, what useful skills they have, and how you can encourage residents to become TreeKeepers. Training classes for new TreeKeepers will be held in three suburban locations this fall (Ryerson Woods in Lake County; The Morton Arboretum, DuPage County; Chicago and Evanston, Cook County).
